





Peasants of Thuringia prevent rot and other diseased conditions of winter-see! potatoes by a simple method. They lay the potatoes in a sunny place, as far apart from each other as possible. The tubers are turned over night and morning until they become thor oughly green, and are then placed in the cellar for the winter. It is claimed that potatoes treated thus do not rot and can withstand great cold without freezing. The effect of the treatment on early polatoes is to prevent their sprouting in the cellar, and so retain their full strength. In February the tubers are taken from the cellar and put into a moderately warm room until planting time. This plan gives s strongly and quickly spronting plant ing potato, and insures a fine yield of healthy vegetables.
