DESERVED WIFE AND CHILD. CONRAD GRABBE RECEIVED HIS PAY IN THE SILK MILLS HERE TWO WEEKS AGO AND HAS NOT BEEN SEEN SINCE.

Left Young Wife and a Babe About Four Months Old--His Wife is Broken Hearted and His Babe is Almost Sick unto Death.

Conrad Grabbe of West Center street, who was employed as a weaver at Cheney Brothers silk mills in what is known as the "Throwing Mill" weaver room, drew his pay two weeks ago last Tuesday and without a word of warning to his young wife left town, and in so far as can be ascertained has not been seen or heard from since by anyone hereabouts.

Grabbe enlisted and went to the Spanish-American war with Company G C.N. and on his return home married Miss Lena Schmitt, daughter of Henry Schultz of West Center street.

He had been complaining to his wife that he was not earning good wages of late, but a search of the pay rolls reveals the fact that for some time past he had been averaging about \$2.94 a day.

He did not use all of his earnings in the house and the presumption is that he was saving it for the purpose of going away. He has been known to express the wish that he could go to the Philippines or to Cuba and this leads to the belief that he may have been planning this for some time past and in order to save the money to pay his way complained to his wife that he was not earning good wages, so as to cover his efforts to withhold his pay.

SUDDEN DEATH OF JAMES HENRY LEGGETT. James Henry Leggett of School street (East end) died rather suddenly last Tuesday afternoon at 5 o'clock. He had been ill with rheumatism and unable to work for three weeks, but that was not considered of itself to be dangerous.

He was thirty three years of age and leaves a wife and two pretty little girls, the oldest one being 6 years of age. His funeral is taking place this afternoon at two o'clock, just as we are going to press, Rev. J. A. Biddle is officiating. Interment will be in the East cemetery.

During the past year Mr. and Mrs. Leggett built a double tenement on the East end of School street and both have been paying monthly to beautify it and to meet the payments on same. As a matter of course it encumbered them with some debt to do this, but with stout hearts and willing hands both took hold to meet their obligations, happy in the belief that it would be a home for them in the years to come. Their fond hopes are thus sadly shattered by the coming of the ever unwise messenger, who has taken Mrs. Leggett's life in his main stay, her comeliest and dearest of the man who was laboring faithfully by her side to bring about the result that was the fondest dream of both and for which both earnestly prayed.
