WE LOST OUR GRIP.

The facts in the case are these: When our edition was about half off the gripper attachment on our press refused to work and in spite of our constant efforts it was impossible to overcome the difficulty. In our dilemma we telephoned our esteemed contemporary, E. S. Ellis of The Herald and related to him our woes. He very promptly and courteously invited us to bring our press, paper and operatives to his office and use his press and electric motor for the work; which we gladly did, but could not finish in time to reach our press on Friday afternoon. Such of our readers as secured their papers first served the public as far as their supplies went and came back for more, but not get them. A machinist, Gilbert B. Norton, restored our gripper attachment to its normal condition and now we are happy.

NO MORE FAIRS.

Father McGurk stated last Sunday that in looking over the accounts of the late fair he found nearly \$1,500 had been realized as a result of the efforts put forth and also observed that there was an actual cash expenditure, in order to bring about this result, of a sum of money nearly equivalent to the amount realized after all bills were paid.

He therefore came to the conclusion that this was an unnecessary outlay of money and energy, and made up his mind very thoroughly that the net cash result could be realized in a far more economical, and to his mind satisfactory manner.

To this end he made a proposition which he left to the people to think over and let him know the result of their deliberations, and if they agreed with his plan it would be put in operation at the beginning of the twentieth century.

The principal advantage of this method is that every dollar invested in this way will have a direct application on the object to which it is directed, and it will not be necessary to make such a drain of cash and of energy each year to realize the results which have been accomplished in the past three years.

The simplicity of the plan and its manifest fairness in lightening the burden and distributing it more evenly than heretofore cannot but appeal to all fair minded persons in the parish.

There is no doubt that as much money can be realized in this way as has ever been done by the fairs and certainly it will be done in a far more agreeable, economical and pleasant fashion.
