Complaints of Nuisances, Etc. Regulation 1. Any complaint made to the Town Health Officer may be required by him to be in writing, and to show the signature of the complainant. Regulation 2. Every physician shall report in writing to the Town Health Officer within twelve hours after his recognition of the disease, every case of cholera, yellow fever, typhoid fever, diphtheria, scarlet fever, membranous croup, typhoid fever, scarlet fever, erysipelas, smallpox, pneumonia, pulmonary tuberculosis, consumption or other contagious or infectious disease, except those of which the patient is recovering.
