In the course of his address to the people of St. James church last Sunday morning, Rev. W. J. McGurk gave his attention to the strike now in progress by the weavers of Cheney Brothers mills in this place.

He stated that Chas. Brothers had always been public spirited citizens, that they had been benefactors in general, that the great prosperity which they had enjoyed was due very largely to the qualifications of this firm, that no local need ever arose to which they did not subscribe freely.

These facts he said he could not take up arms against them. His sense of honor and gratitude forbade him to do so.
