### ORANGEMEN'S HALL. A CLOSE CALL. DRESS HINTS.

William J. Smith has Contract—Will Be Built For Ten Dollars, and Ornaments For Janitor—Modern and Ornamental Facade Will Be Beautifully Located.

Notwithstanding the fact that the section of the Orangemen's proposed block on East Center street near Main has been deferred, the project has not been abandoned and last Monday the contract for same was let to William J. Smith, one of our local contractors. The building will be constructed of red brick, with white marble trimmings, will have a handsomely ornamented facade, and will beautify the locality very much. It will be two stories high with basement. On the ground floor will be two stories, 23x50 feet, and at the rear of the stores will be apartments for the janitor. These will consist of a six room flat, having bath, lavatory, toilet, steam heat, electric lights, and all modern equipments.

Each store will have separate cellar and storage room and arrangements will be made for the janitor. The building will be finished in a fine view of Main street. There will be a banquet room in the basement 42x48 feet. This will be equipped with kitchen and all things necessary for doing the work required. On the second floor the lodge room, ante rooms and cloak rooms will occupy the entire floor, and will be built in accordance with the most improved and modern methods now in use. There will be metal ceilings in the lodge room, and in the store.

The lodge room will be an extra large one, 48x64 feet, with raised platform, bar room, check room, coat room, preparation room. The building will be a ladies parlor or committee room 16x21 feet. The building will be heated by steam, lighted by electricity and have metal ceilings throughout, except the janitor's quarters. The building will be modern in every respect and of the best quality that can be procured. The Orangemen will spare no expense to have everything of the best and give the best of their money for the building that will be an ornament to East Center street. It will cost when completed about \$160,000.

The cellar will be built by Pusey Gorham and the balance of the work will be subject to sub-contract as Mr. Smith may see fit to make. It is intended to go ahead with the work and the contractor will endeavor to have it ready for occupancy about the first of November.

The fair which the Orangemen were to have given this spring has been postponed and will occur on some of their own home can be prepared for their use. Given the inspiration of the new and elegant building before them, all concerned will labor more willingly and industriously to make the fair a success and to secure funds enough to pay for a considerable portion of the cost of their new block.

The Orangemen made no mistake in awarding the contract for their handsome new building to Mr. Smith. He is a member of the building committee, has worked with Norcross Brothers, one of the largest contractors in this State, and although he is the youngest contractor and builder in town, has had considerable experience erecting large as well as small structures. The building will have a tin roof.

**MORE MADRID.**

It is expected that the plan will be finished this week. As soon thereafter as possible the selectmen will advertise for bids for the construction of this strip of macadam road and the work will be started as early as practicable. Should some local contractor secure the job, he could find a number of men here to do the work. Striking velvet weavers and other men who are displaced because of the strike, would doubtless avail themselves of the opportunity of earning some money in this way. A number have been working as old jobs that offered about town in order to maintain themselves and their families, and avoid the necessity of seeking financial aid from other sources, such as the toll of their own hands.

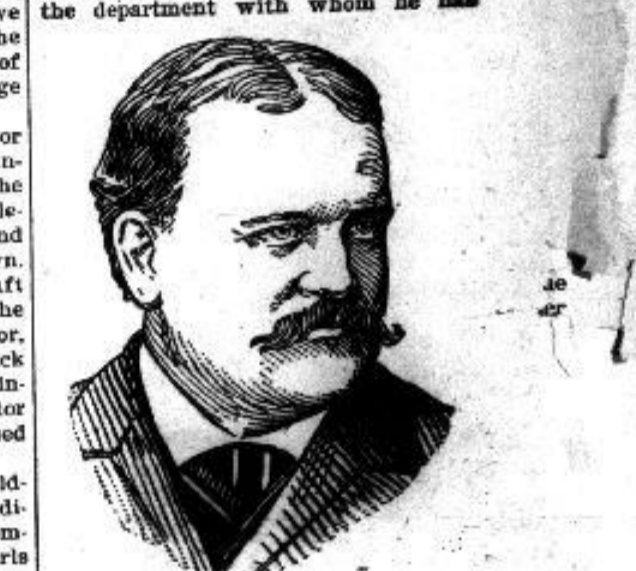
