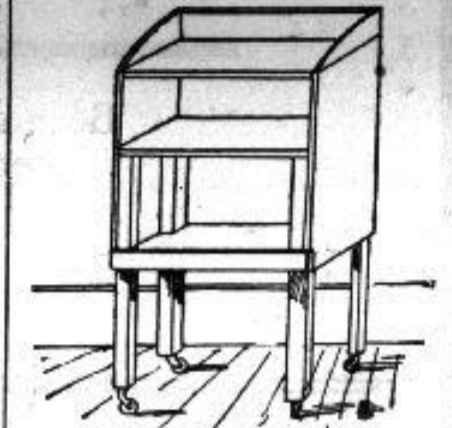

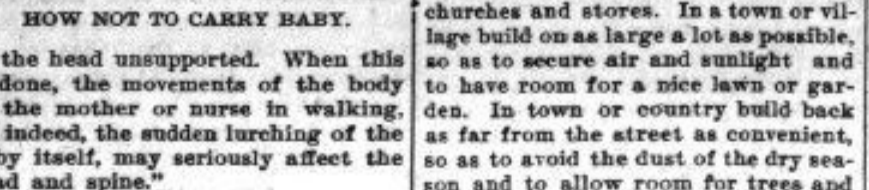

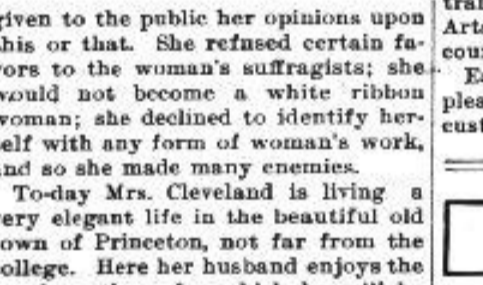

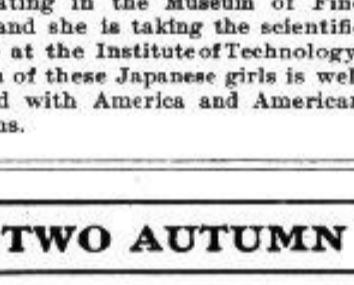


MIRROR OF A GREEK BEAUTY.

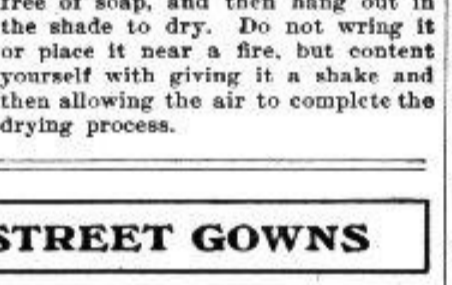

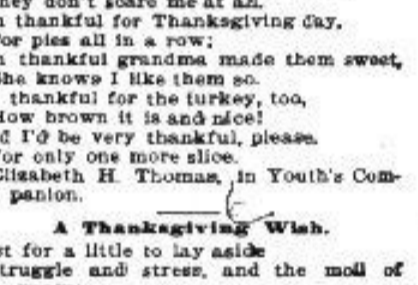

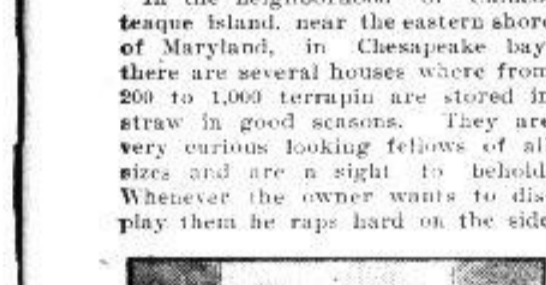

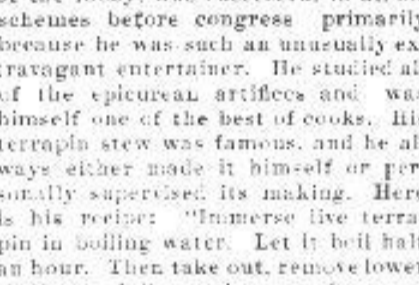

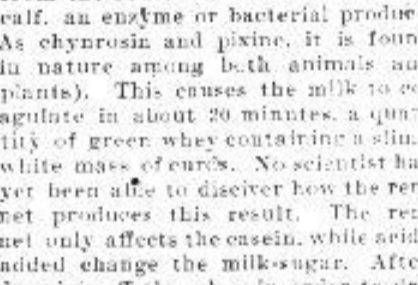

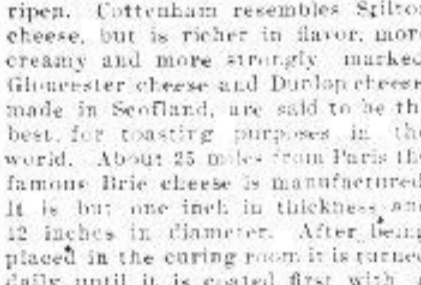
