BEER'S NEW DIRECTORY.

Year After Year Marks the Onward Progress of This Great Publication. Sixty-seventh Volume just issued leads the Rest—it is not Exceeded in Historic Value By Any Directory Published.

The estimated population of Hartford is 89,024, according to the sixth-seventh volume of Beer's Hartford and East Hartford Directory for 1904, which can be found in this office, and is at the disposal of any person so desiring.

The new directory shows that 9,448 new names have been added, 7,080 were struck out as having moved away, 410 disappeared from notice, making a net gain of 1,457.

The original canvass for the directory ended June 21 but in order to make it more complete and accurate the canvass has been reviewed since that date.

The classified list now in the directory consists of 8,133 firms and companies doing business and classified under 1,848 headings.

Beer's Street Guide has been amplified more than one half its size. In these past four years, and this is the most extensive issue issued of any city, having in addition to the number of street corners, the locations of all churches, schools, public halls, office buildings, hotels, garages, spots of historic note, public parks and size, the ends of trolley car lines, and many of the prominent business houses, etc.

The recapitulation of names is as follows: Names of residents, etc. in the city, July, 1904, 48,116. Removal of migrations out of the city, whose names were in the 1903 directory, 1,927. Necrology or deaths from June 1, 1903 to June 1, 1904, 1,437.

Total number of names in Hartford City Directory, 46,809. Names in last year's directory, 45,448. Change in residence and business locations, 10,346. New names added this year, 9,443.

Grand total number of names in this year's directory, 48,807. Half-ton photographs of 639 leading citizens are given, being an addition of sixty-five new faces. Reference to the tables of the directory from 1878 to 1888 shows that the largest gain in names was in 1896, when the gain was 3,291, and the smallest gain was in 1899, when the gain was six.
