BUSINESS MEN'S BANQUET

SEVENTH ANNUAL GATHERING OF LOCAL ASSOCIATION HELD LAST EVENING.

Attendance Larger Than Ever—William C. Cheney, Mayor of Manchester—Glen R. Wood Gives Principal Address—Evening Here Made Parodies Case 34th Amendment.

The seventh annual banquet of the Manchester Business Men's Association took place at Odd Fellows hall last evening, and witnessed the assembling of the largest number that ever attended any of these gatherings. Here, the actual number of diners being 100.

The committee made arrangements to have the festivities of the evening start earlier than usual, and promptly at 6 o'clock an announcement was made of the invited guests who had places set apart for them in the banquet hall, after which all others came in and took positions at the various tables.

Rev. Charles N. L. Wall, pastor of the North Congregational church, gave a blessing, and at 8:15 the business of the evening which encircle the room, where they could comfortably enjoy the speech-making which followed. The first on the table was the address of welcome delivered by President Hale. It was as follows:

The speaker's table was arranged on the east side of the hall, running north to south and accommodated twenty-four persons. The other tables were arranged at right angles to it, and besides the five large tables running east and west,
