possibility to produce such a large design on metal rolls. The mechanical difficulties overcome in the production of fabrics of the kind shown here are almost incredible.

There is one grand Venetian Red specimen of damask shown, in which the design is sixty-three inches in length and requires nearly a million thread crossings in a single repeat of the design.

Down stairs in the north lodge room will be found an exhibit of Flossomines and printed goods as distinguished from the woven fabrics upstairs. The walls will be covered in like manner as those of the main hall, and tables will be placed as on the east side of the hall nearest above.

There is a rare old Venetian Red altar cloth in silk velvet, the color which is now in vogue in the style of three hundred years ago, and is an imitation of a piece of rare antique velvet given to Cheney Brothers by the late Stamford White of New York.
