SOUTH MANCHESTER BOYS HEROES OF DAY AT INTERSCHOLASTIC MEET IN HYDE PARK, ROCKVILLE.

Carried Off Thirty Six Points To Rockville's Thirty Three—Three Events To Be Exploited Yet Victory Never in Danger of Being Lured Away From South Manchester—Large Attendance.

The interscholastic meet held at Hyde Park, Rockville, last Saturday afternoon by teams representing the South Manchester, Rockville and Enfield High schools was won by the athletes of the South Manchester High school by a margin of three points over Rockville, the South Manchester boys securing 36 points while the Rockville boys gained 33, and Enfield had 31 points.

It was an ideal day for the meet and fully 1,000 persons attended. South Manchester sent up three special cars well loaded containing about 100 pupils, relatives and friends. The various events were contested in a spirited and friendly manner, and Principal Verplanck of the South Manchester High school is exceedingly well pleased with the general result. He is of the opinion that these interscholastic meets are a very excellent thing to have and hopes to be able to arrange for a similar meet at Hyde Park next year.
