THERE'S MANY A SLIP

FATE OF BUCKLAND FIRE DISTRICT TREMBLING IN BALANCE—OPPOSITION SCORED LAST EVENING.

Cleric Parliamentary Measure Prevents Election of Officers—Majority Won Against Project Appears To Be Eighteen—Mistaken Work Done Since Previous Meeting.

An adjourned meeting of the Seventh School District was held at the Buckland School building last night for the purpose of electing officers for the year 1909. A motion to adjourn was unopposed and carried with a rush before any other official action could be taken and the meeting was accordingly adjourned without date.

It will be remembered that a week ago the voters of the Seventh School District voted to organize a fire district to be known as the Buckland Fire District. The vote ordering this procedure passed by the slender margin of one to spare, the figures being 86 for and 85 against the formation of a fire district.

It was deemed best at that time to appoint a committee to carefully prepare a list of the names of candidates for officers of the Buckland Fire District and present same for action at the adjourned meeting which was to be held last evening.

Clinton Williams shrewdly invoked the aid of parliamentary procedure and unexpectedly offered a motion to adjourn, which was promptly seconded. This was put to a vote by the chairman, George B. Slater, and declared carried, whereupon the "nothing doing" sign was immediately displayed. The vote was 81 in favor and 23 against. In this case the number "23" proved a real alibi.

It was observed by persons at the meeting that there were ten persons who voted against the formation of a fire district a week ago who were not present at the meeting last evening. Notwithstanding this fact a majority of eight voted in favor of adjournment last evening showing a change of eight votes during the week in opposition to the formation of a district, and an apparent majority of 18 for the anti.

The next step in the procedure is to have those persons favoring the organization of a Buckland Fire District draw up a petition calling for a meeting of the electors of the Seventh School District and naming a place for this meeting. The petition must have at least ten signatures of electors of the district. This petition must be presented to Clinton Williams, who is the district committee. Under the statute law as framed at present, it is incumbent upon the district committee to

BARN BURNED

BELONGING TO CHENEY BROTHERS ON WEDNESDAY EVENING—BUILDING AND CONTENTS CONSUMED

Location Far Removed From Fire Fighting Apparatus—Long Uphill Run for Firemen of Hose and Ladder Companies No. One and No. Four—Nothing Could Be Done to Save Property.

About 10 o'clock Wednesday evening the fire alarm signal was rung in from Box No. 13, a private fire alarm station on Frank W. Cheney's farm. The Cheney street barn, owned by Cheney Brothers, together with its contents was totally consumed by fire within a short time after the alarm was sounded.

Cheney Company No. 1 brought their equipment to the fire and spread a line of hose. The fire had made such progress before the firemen arrived that it was impossible to do anything toward saving the property. The barn was not a large one and had been constructed many years ago. It was used for storing hay, of which it had probably twenty tons and there were also several thousand bushels of peas and berry baskets in the building.

Cheney's farm in handling fruit, vegetables, etc. It is estimated that the building and contents were worth \$2,000. The property was fully insured. It is not known how the fire originated. It is estimated that the discovery was made and as the location was remote from any fire apparatus, and further, the barn being an uphill run, much time was employed in getting the apparatus to the scene of action. There is but one hydrant in that immediate vicinity.
