FOR BASE BALL. ROCKVILLE INNOVATION COMES OUT STRONGLY IN FAVOR OF PLAN SUBMITTED BY THE NEWS.

Declares There is a General Desire in Rockville for Resumption of Base Ball Negotiations on Basis of Letting By-gones Be By-gones and Renewing Activities With States Wiped Clean.

THE following article taken from the Rockville Journal shows a commendable spirit and meets with hearty approval here. It is encouraging to be advised from that source that there is a genuine desire in Rockville for the resumption of baseball negotiations between Rockville and Manchester, and that there is an earnest desire in Rockville to let bygones be bygones and to start anew with the states wiped clean.

"It was pretty clearly demonstrated in both Rockville and Manchester last season that neither can have successful baseball of the class to which both places have become accustomed, with one on the other. The plan was tried last year in Manchester independent of Rockville and hardly a corporal's guard turned out to the games. The same was true of this city, a few of the faithful were on hand, but they were not enough to meet expense. With the brand of baseball that Rockville and Manchester have been used to, it is necessary to have a crowd equal to the baseball fans in both places to make the receipts sufficient to meet the expenses. Each town is satisfied that it is impossible for either one to conduct successful baseball without the other.

"Since the above was written, The Journal learns that there was a conference in this city Sunday seeking to bring about just what The Journal reports. Parties in Manchester (not in any way connected with the old board of directors or management), came to Rockville to confer with a like number of business men, to see if it cannot be arranged to have baseball between the towns representing the two places. They talked the matter over from a common sense viewpoint, reaching the goal of the game in both places.

"The Manchester conference states that the association has decided to dispose of the property this spring, therefore, if anything is to be done to retain the present grounds, they must act at once. If no arrangement can be made with Rockville, then the grounds will be sold for building lots, and there will be no chance for baseball for some time to come. There is an element in Manchester, and likewise one here, that would like to see baseball relations between the towns renewed. Nothing can be gained by reviving old claims and keeping alive old grievances.

"The business men of both Rockville and Manchester realize that baseball is a good thing for the town, and they want to see the old relations renewed. And there is no reason why they should not. Just because those at the head of the Rockville baseball association in 1907 and 1908, feel personally aggrieved, is no reason why the whole city should be kept from having good, fast baseball the coming season.

"A team can be run independent of the baseball association if they proceed in the 'Doe in the Manager' attitude. One business man told The Journal that he would be one of twenty men to put up \$100 to start a baseball fund for a series of games with Manchester. The sentiment is growing, and it seems as if it were high time to forget old scores and bargaining on bygones, and get down to the plain proposition of whether or not Rockville desires fast baseball the coming season. It can be had, and The Journal believes that the masses would rather see a good game of ball than to hear the old song of 'Up the Hill'.

The Feeling of Pride That is Born of Paying Taxes.
"Many a time," said a policeman in the southern part of the city, "when arresting men, especially intoxicated men, I have been told by my prisoner that he was a taxpayer and that he helped pay my wages."
"I always regarded this sort of back talk as merely drunken insolence and never paid much attention to it until about a year ago, when I bought a house and lot and became myself a taxpayer. I had always rented before and never gave a thought to taxes, but as soon as I moved into my own house I began to appreciate the feelings of men who resented arrest because they paid taxes."
"There is certainly a considerable addition to the dignity of the man who helps support the government. He feels a degree of responsibility that a renter or roomer never understands, and my idea is that every man in the country ought to become a taxpayer as soon as he can. And the more that he does help support the government and bears his share of the expense makes him a better citizen. Habitual criminals are rarely taxpayers. 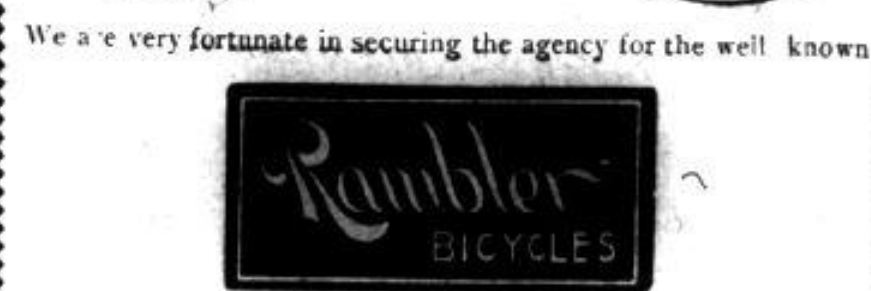
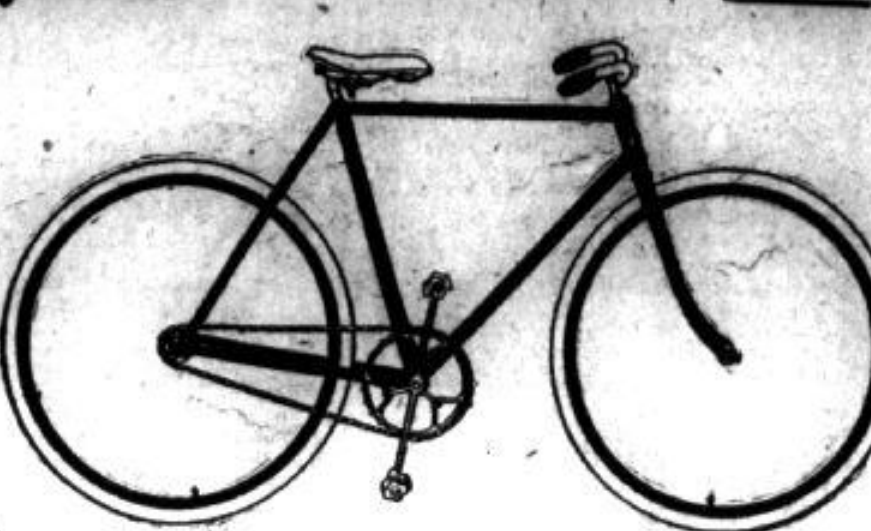

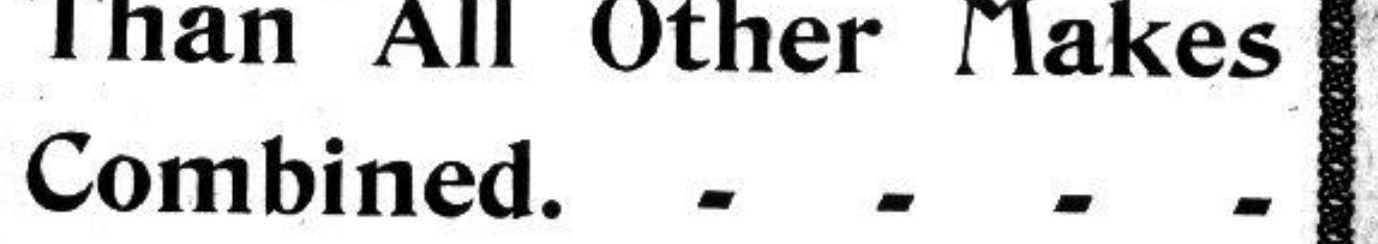
