

A coating of elephant fat and blood is a popular substitute for clothing among certain Uganda savages, who believe that no people should wear clothes until after marriage. Elephant hunters in Uganda find ant hills a valuable aid as observatories. These hills tower to a considerable

height, and many of them can be easily climbed. Others rise sharply like smokestacks, and, being hollow, holes are frequently dug in their sides and fires built for cooking. A perfect draft is produced by the hollow interior, and the smoke is carried off at the top. So numerous are these hills that they are a distinctive, a typical, feature of the country. Cases are known where hunters have saved their lives from charging elephants by dodging behind convenient ant hills.
