ENOUGH'S SAID!

Connecticut Legislative Review

Public Utilities Commission Still Center of Attraction—Attendance at Hearing Last Tuesday Small—Public Not Much Interested in Phase Then Under Consideration—Mr. Mellen's Letter.

HARTFORD, June 1.—It has all of the time been maintained by those who oppose the establishment of a public utility commission in this state that there was no public demand for it and that there are to "come" two more hearings on the subject on phases of the subject, possibly to interest the general public than did that of today on the control of the financial operations of public service corporations, namely, control of rates and control of management and operation—the first attendance at today's hearing would tend to show that there is a public demand for it.

President Mellen's most interesting letter to the commission, compared with the number one would have expected and which should have been there if there was any general interest in the matter, quite a number were members of the House, there were a very few senators and most of the rest are regularly absent from the Capitol in some capacity or other.

As before remarked, and as other newspapers have tried to make plain of late, tomorrow's hearing on rates is the big hearing of the series and in that respect it may be considered by those who expect to be a large number of men if any real interest in the general proposition. The event will speak for itself. It is up to the public, however.

The commission's plan for the holding of these hearings has been practically instructed to bring in some sort of a bill, but the commission will go out of its way and spend its time at this stage in the general proposition, unless there is shown a desire on the part of the public for the creation of a commission.

If, then, there isn't shown such interest and I must say that I have already seen in connection with this matter gives me to think that there isn't, and the commission will probably suggest a commission of any kind there will be as good as a howl of protest against such action and the legislature will be scolded from Elkhart to the Danbury Fair grounds for stepping its duty. Which is hardly a reasonable matter.

This is about as far as one can go on this subject up to date. The reasons why the New Haven people are so generally opposed to the establishment of a commission empowered to exercise the restrictive control over rates and other affairs which the bill reported by the 1937 commission provided for were cogent and clear and Mr. Mellen's letter, from plain to anyone willing to look at the subject in an unbiased way that it is out of the question for the New Haven road to go ahead with its present plans, even if there should come into existence a commission of the kind proposed by the governor with the power to compel it to make public every move it makes and to make and every plan according to which its plans were made, with out regard to what those plans are or where they lead.

This capitalization and financial end of the public utility proposition is by no means the popular end, anyway, if it has a popular end. People generally care very little how much water there is in a stock or an issue of bonds. Rates and general management interest them far more. To a commission somewhat along the lines of the present railroad commission, but with broader powers, there would really be little objection on the part of Mr. Mellen's company. There has been no definite opposition from that source heretofore. It is the Southern New England Telephone company and the smaller corporations which have been fighting the corporation end of the fight.

The New Haven road people have rather felt that they had borne the brunt of the battle for this side for some years back and the smaller corporations had profited and now that they felt as they do about a commission of the kind proposed, they would not let matters take their own course. When, however, the restrictive commission bill has made it the piece of resistance of the whole subject for the time being, the public feature has been made plain.
