Matter of Counting Ballots Greatly Facilitated by Putting More Counters at Work and Not Counting Votes in Cases Where There Were No Contests for Nominations on Republican Ballots.

The direct primary for the nomination of town officers in the Republican and Democratic parties was held at the town hall last Tuesday, the polls opening at 9 a. m. and closing at 8 p. m.
