Mr. Donnelly was a member of the Knights of the Maccabees. He is survived by a widow, Mrs. Annie Downs Donnelly; his mother, Mrs. Thomas Donnelly, and three children, Sophia, Marie, and Frank William Donnelly, all of Hartford. He also leaves six brothers, Thomas Donnelly of Bridgeport and Abraham, Ambrose, Edward, Frank and Robert, of Paterson, N. J., and one sister, Mrs. Levi Chapman, also of Paterson.

HENRY WELLS SADD
Henry Wells Sadd, one of the best known residents of Wapping, died of the Sudd Memorial Library of that place and a leading factor in most of the improvements in this town died Tuesday morning.
He was born in Wapping August 17, 1834, his parents being William and Marcella Sadd, old residents of Wapping. He was a descendant of the early settlers of the colonies, his first American ancestor on his father's side being John Sadd, who settled in Hartford in 1637.
Mr. Sadd was married three times. His first wife, who was Miss Abigail Avery of South Windsor, died in 1806. To his first marriage there were born four sons. 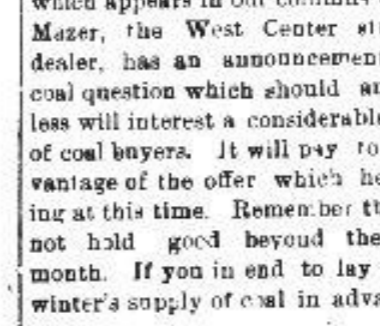

Street Lights The South Manchester Light Power & Tramway Company have put in a few larger tungsten street lights on Main street at street corners and at the Orange hall building. They are installing them with a view to ascertain if the change be satisfactory or otherwise. Observing persons are able to note the great contrast between these new and enlarged lights and the carbon filament lights which are still used upon the side streets.

The new tungsten are 50 candle power and certainly give an excellent light. They are being placed at street corners for the present during the experimental period. The ordinary carbon filament street lights are of 32 candle power. They look almost like tall, thin candles with light rays radiating from their tips.

Electrician L. N. Webster is likely to be broken up as are the 32s which were the largest used on the street circuit herebefore. The manufacturers of carbon filament lamps are raising the prices. This fact will serve to bring the tungsten lights into more general use. They are the best lights known at present that are practical for street lighting.

Superintendent Heblner reports that the street lighting companies are very much annoyed and put to great expense by the breaking of street lamps by boys. A case was discovered recently and it is expected that the boy or boys who did the breaking is likely to be definitely located and placed under arrest. The police have been given information which would assist them in running down the offenders. It is intended to inflict severe punishment upon any persons proven to be guilty of breaking street lamps.

It is the purpose of the light companies to put a stop to this. Boys who have been of the opinion that this kind of lawlessness would be permitted had better take heed of this warning.
