DIRECT METHOD OF MAKING NOMINATIONS BY BALLOT TRIED AGAIN

Largest Vote Ever Polled—Unusual Number of Ballots Rejected—Auto Outlawed Horse for Election Purpose—Weary Work of Counters.

For the third time in the history of the Town of Manchester and also in the State of Connecticut the Direct Primary was tried out at the town hall last Tuesday. Voting began at nine o'clock in the morning and closed, at eight o'clock at night.

Some of the voters placed their X marks on the right hand side of the name of the candidate in the box on the left, and the ballot was rejected accordingly. Some of the voters placed their X on the left hand side of the name of the candidate for whom his election wished to vote.

At the close of the polls counting the ballots was started immediately. An astonishingly large number of ballots were known within half an hour after the counting started, but it took until 1:45 the following morning to finish the count of the Republican ballots.

During the evening interested persons in the town hall as in the custom to get the result of the election, but as the hours wore along the watches became weary and gradually departed to their homes, as their patience was fully exhausted and they saw no reasonable means of reaching the result during the time at their disposal.

The Direct Primary passed off pleasantly in all particulars excepting in the matter of counting which of course, was tedious and long drawn out process. The matter proved to be better than throughout the major portion of the day and evening, although the morning was raw and cold and cloudy and threatened rain.

Many voters who were employed about town in bringing voters to and from the polls; the faithful horse being entirely out of the work in both speed and endurance. There was no shortage of auto conveyances.

There was but one break in the line of seclusion on the republican side. Those services last year were all selected with the exception of John M. Williams. Dr. Thomas H. Wedon of the new republican member of the board.
