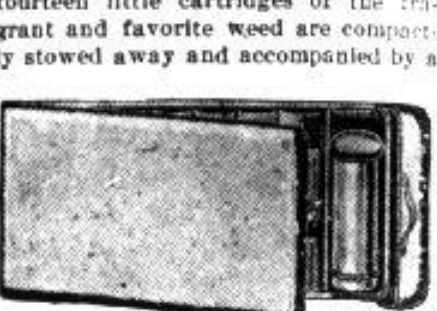

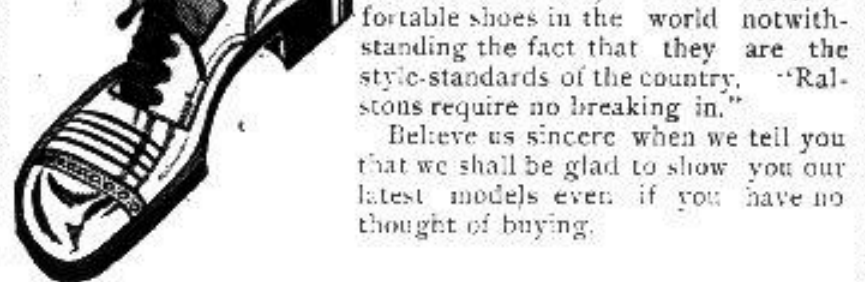

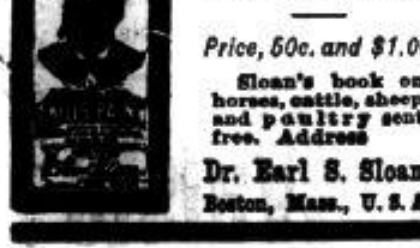

Selling By Weight

Representative Aaron Johnson of this place one of our leading grocers, hereby gives notice that he intends to introduce a bill in the incoming legislature making it compulsory for manufacturers to sell food products in packages by net weight.

I am preparing a bill to be introduced in the next general assembly concerning the net weight on packages of food products. People have a right to know what they buy and they also should have a right to know what they pay for what they buy.

A customer has a right to ask me how much he gets for his money and I ought to be able to tell him. The retailer is not well to pay for how many crackers or cookies there are in these packages or how much soap in that bottle or coffee in that can or cans in that package.

Let us take the case of a five-ounce glass. 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Thanksgiving Proclamation

Washington, Nov. 6.—The annual Thanksgiving Day proclamation issued by President Taft today—It follows: This year of 1910 is drawing to a close. The records of population and harvest, which are the index of progress, show vigorous national growth and the health and prosperous well-being of our communities throughout this land and in our possessions beyond the seas.

We continue to be at peace with the rest of the world. In all essential matters our relations with other peoples are harmonious, with an ever growing reality of friendships and depth of recognition of mutual dependence.

Now, therefore, I, William Howard Taft, President of the United States of America, in accordance with the wise custom of the civil magistrates since the first settlements in this land and foundation of the government, do appoint Thursday, November 24, 1910, as a day of national thanksgiving and prayer, rejoicing in the people upon that day to most in their capacity for the praise of Almighty God and to return hearty thanks to Him for all His goodness and loving kindness.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the United States to be affixed.

Done at the City of Washington, this fifth day of November, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and eighth of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and thirty-fifth.

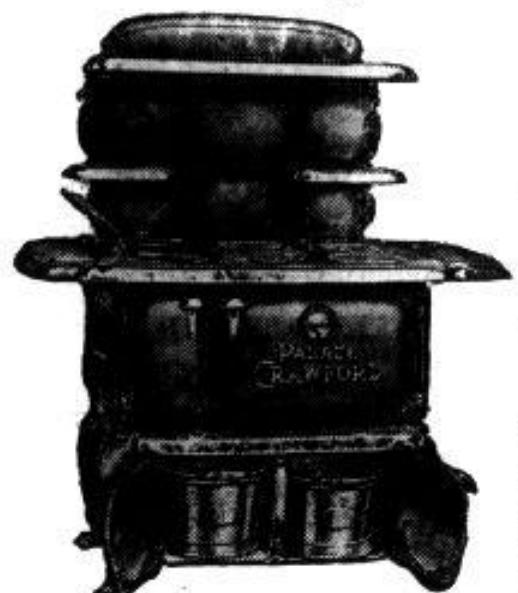

III.—Pure Food in the Home

The arrival of food most likely to be contaminated by disease germs is milk.

Food should never be exposed to contact with flies, insects, rats, mice, etc.

Food adulterants have little influence on health, except in so far as they substitute inert or unappetizing material for that which is nourishing and of appetizing flavor.

Many food adulterants have little influence on health, except in so far as they substitute inert or unappetizing material for that which is nourishing and of appetizing flavor.

Some of the more common adulterants are as follows:

Milk—Water has probably been used in excess there was a milkman harmful by decreasing nutritious value.

Various preservatives, as salicylic acid, formalin, boric acid, are also used and are injurious.

Butter—Sometimes adulterated with other fats, which possibly render it less digestible.

Lard—Cottonseed oil is the most common used adulterant.

Canned Vegetables—Salts of copper and zinc are often used to impart a brilliant green color.

Jellies, Jams, Etc.—Aniline dyes are often used to give bright colors.

Beer—Salicylic acid, turpentine, benzoin, aniline dyes, coffee, chloroform, strychnine, cocaine, etc.
