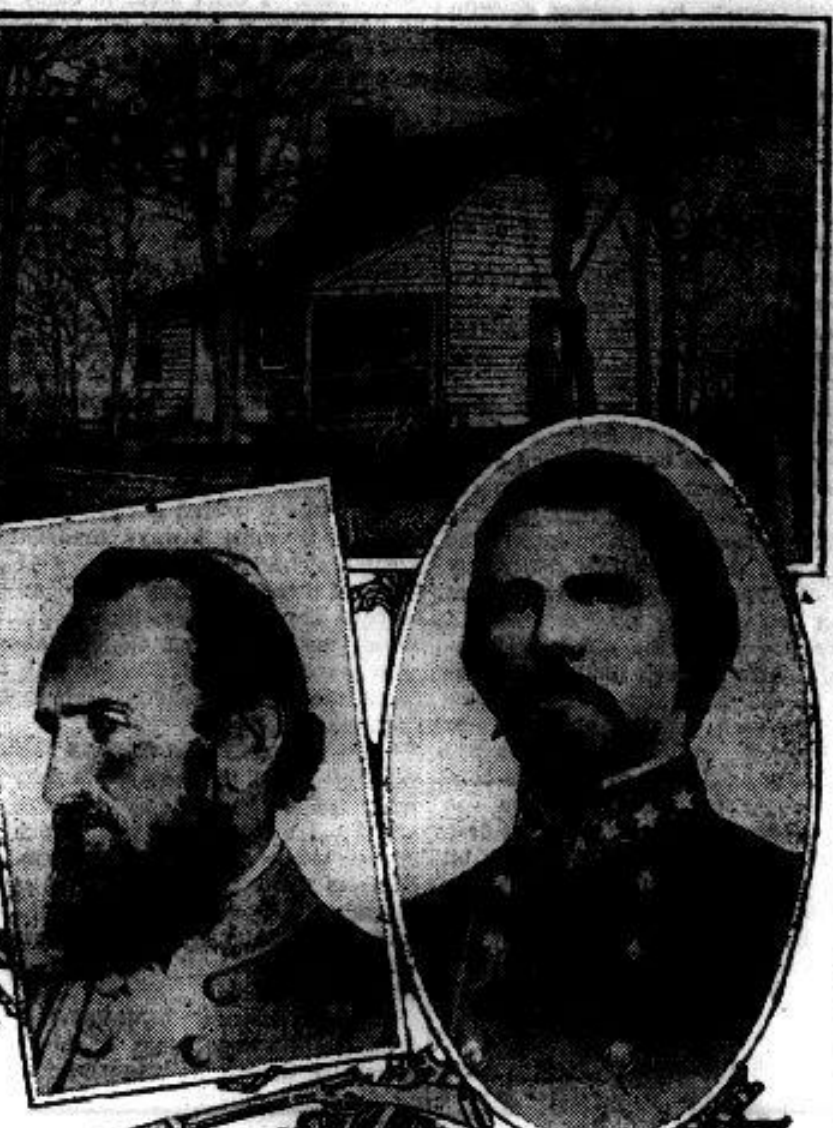

The War Fifty Years Ago

Bull Run Week and the Battle in Front of Washington July 21, 1861--Heavy Fighting Around the Henry House, Storm Center of the Conflict--Heroes of the Day--Sherman's "Highlanders" and the Irish Sixty-ninth New York--Baptism of the First Minnesota--How Jackson Came to Be Called "Stonewall"--Losses of the Day and Who Scored Hits--Brave Artillerymen--Events in Missouri and West Virginia.

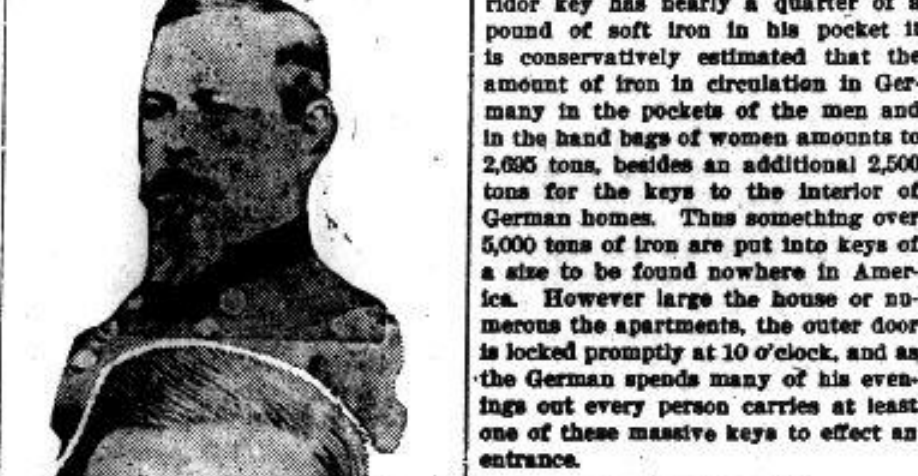

All was going well with them until the regiment, ordered to bivouac for a moment and was about to be deluged with canister, when the chief of artillery declared that the strangers were friends. Several Union regiments were called gray on that field. The general held their fire, but the men in Ricketts' line guns and tried to charge. They were ordered to fire and he himself was killed. 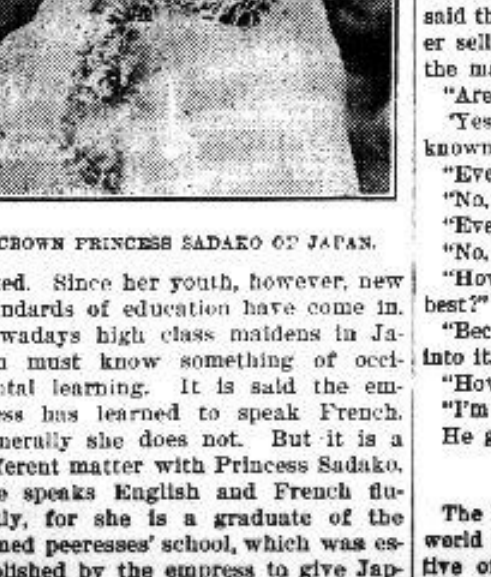
