SELECTMEN MEET

Pay Bills, Receive Petitions and Appoint C. H. Hall Trust Officer The board of selectmen held their regular monthly meeting at the hall of records Monday afternoon and besides disposing of the monthly list of bills they also took action on several minor matters. Charles K. Hatheway made an exhaustive report on the lines of the school districts of the town. Mr. Hatheway said that he had practically relocated the district lines and the board voted to have a map sketched of same. Mr. Hatheway was instructed to file a memorandum of his findings and present same to the board. They will be advertised in the papers and a consent to each of the district clerks. A meeting of the board will then be called at which any aggrieved persons may appear and be heard relative thereto. A town meeting will then be called to take action on the district lines as they are defined.

The board voted to borrow the sum of \$15,000 to meet current expenses. Chief Samuel G. Gorham was instructed to enforce the new law relative to pool rooms and collect a license fee of \$10 from each pool room in town. The new law regarding pool rooms places the authority for enforcing same in the hands of the chief of police and Chief Gorham was instructed to see that the laws are obeyed. It was voted to purchase atlases of Hartford and Tolland counties. W. LeRoy Ulrich was appointed tree warden. Mr. Ulrich was elected tree warden at the last election, but the law calls for the appointing of that official by the board of selectmen. Notice has been brought to the attention of the board that a property owner on Park street is encroaching on the highway and it was voted to instruct the property owner to keep within the bounds. Selectman Howe made a report on the conference he had with the Southern N. E. Telephone Co. relative to a rebate for telephone used by the town officials. The Lyndville light question was taken up again. It was voted to place five lights on Mather street and to re-locate three lights from Woodbridge street and place them on Parker street. Town Counsel Olin R. Wood reported on the legal status of Russell street. The board voted to accept the map and survey of the street and in the call for the next town meeting a clause will be inserted for the acceptance of the street as a town highway. At the evening session of the board Carl Bolin of Oak street appeared in behalf of his mother, Mrs. August Bolin, a property owner on that street, asking the board to place lights on the eastern extension of the street. William Johnson another resident and property owner of that street, appeared in advocacy of the petition. Chairman Cheney told the petitioners that Oak street had been accepted by the town only as far as a point about one hundred yards west of Clinton street and that therefore the selectmen had no authority to place lights on a part of that street that was not owned by the town. Chairman Cheney explained the necessary procedure to acquire their desires. The street would have to be placed in proper condition, a survey of that section of the street would have to be made, a map drawn up and same presented to the board of selectmen. The board would then pass on its acceptability and if they acted favorably would insert a clause in the call for a town meeting for the acceptance of that street as a town highway. It would be possible to place lights thereon. Alexander Hall appeared before the board complaining of the bad condition of Vernon street in Lyndville. He thought that some action should be taken to remedy this condition at once. The board voted to instruct Superintendent Ulrich to investigate the matter and report. R. E. Carney inquired what had become of the petition for placing lights on Arch street. The maps of Arch street were brought out and it was shown that this street had not been accepted by the town and consequently the selectmen could not vote to place lights thereon. Mr. Carney said that the street was in good condition, had cobble gutters and so forth and was a very much traveled thoroughfare. Chairman Cheney said that Cheney

These statements made and presented by the company. Their strictures, he contended, should be presented in their arguments later.

Both opposing counsel urged that the company be forced to present specific statements of daily receipts and expenditures for a specified time and not mere estimates. They earnestly appealed to the commission to insist upon this. They reiterated that passengers from Hartford to Laurel Park are not through passengers and that the commission should not accept that statement as correct.

Messrs. Burke and Hyde told that it was unfair to their side of the controversy to do this. The report of the auditor of The Connecticut Company regarding receipts and expenditures on the Manchester lines in January and June, 1911.

Mr. Spock admitted he assumed to be correct and on this assumption was laid before the commission.

Mr. Burke sought to secure a copy of the report, or at least to be given an opportunity to examine it at that time. The request was not granted.

Mr. Burke pointed out that it was the superintendent of The Connecticut Company who testified before the commission and not the auditors. The auditor's report as presented now was not made under oath.

Mr. Hyde maintained that the original certificates were sold for \$50 each and that they were issued to stockholders and not to contractors as stated in the reports made to the railroad commission. Mr. Higgins said that if the commission found that the stock books furnished were not the ones wanted that the commission would not hesitate to ask for them and have them produced in their entirety. Mr. Hyde requested the commission to summon Auditor May of the Connecticut Company to appear and testify.

under oath as to the correctness of the statements of receipts and expenditures of the company in operating the Manchester lines during the first six months of the present year.

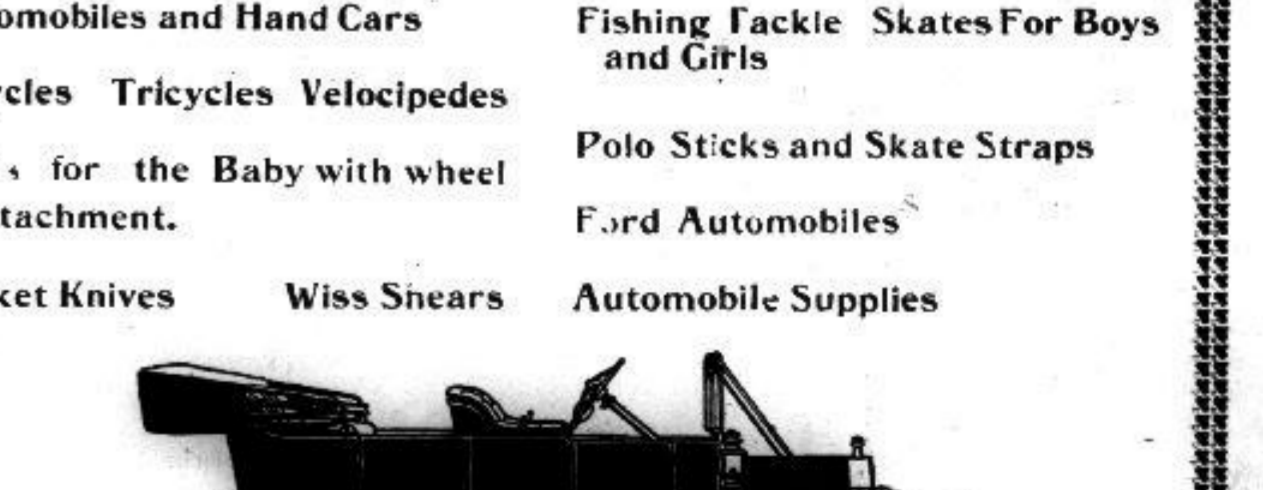

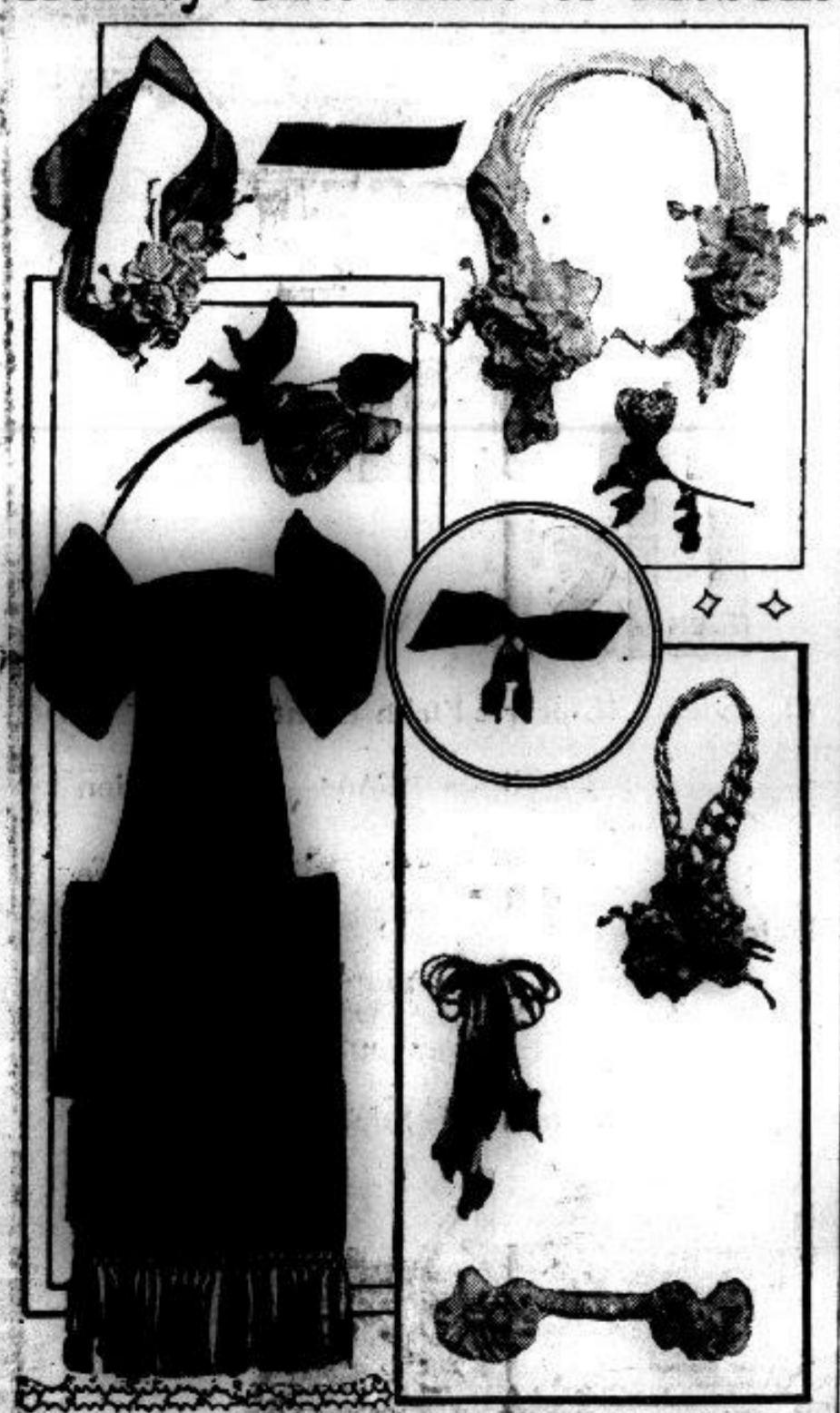
But, so the smile will not rub off, the inward and outward serenity be not roughened, we beg you go early; it is most dangerous to put the

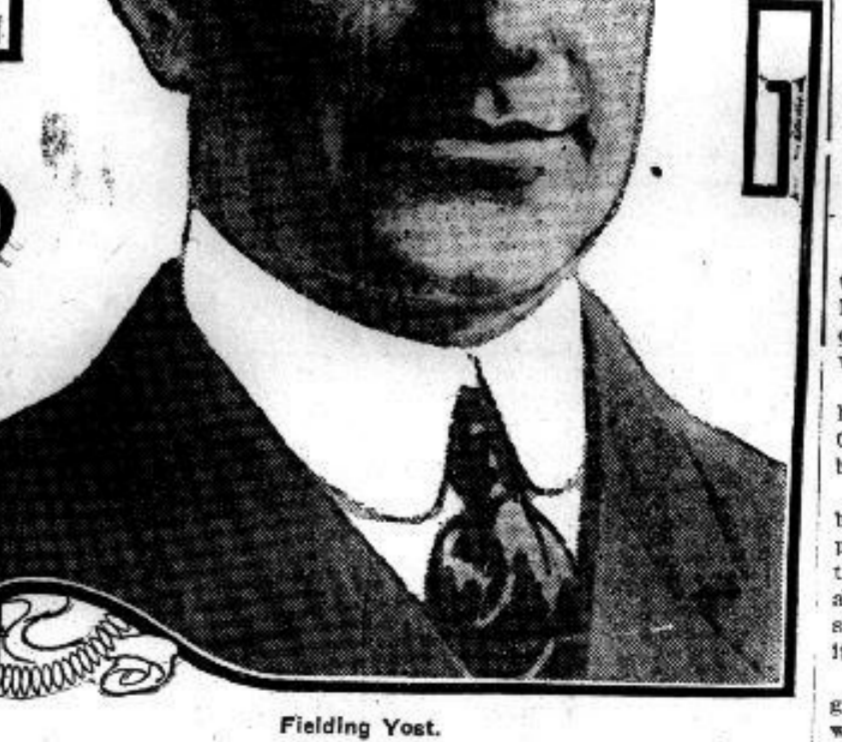
