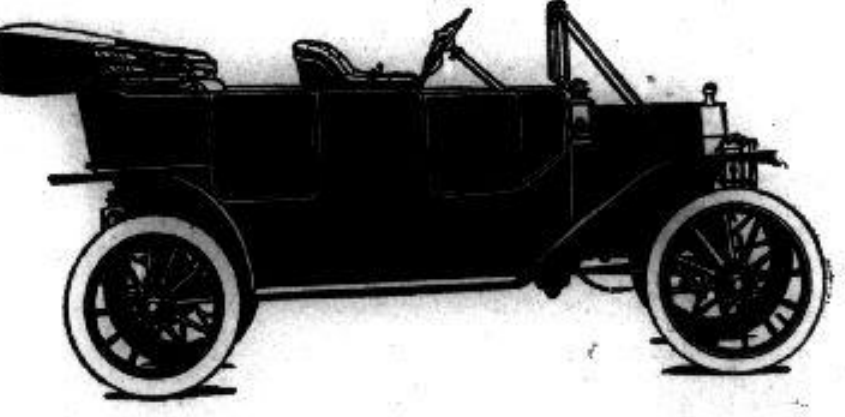
PICK ALL-STAR AGGREGATION New York Paper Makes Selection of Baseball Players From Big Leagues—Few Youngsters Included.

THE HALL OF FAME.

SAMUEL F. B. MORSE—Born
inventor of telegraph. Born
Charlestown, Mass. April
27, 1791; died
New York
April 2, 1872.
Was graduat-
ed from Yale
in 1810. After
studying at
England
under Benjamin
West, the
American painter, he tried to
establish himself as a portrait
painter in several American
cities, opening a studio in New
York in 1820. He was not high-
ly successful as a painter,
though he was the first president
of the National Academy of De-
sign from 1825 to 1842. It was
he who designed the electric
telegraph, a working model of
which he placed on exhibition three
years later. After he had made
many futile efforts to enlist
the private or governmental aid
in the invention congress at last
granted an appropriation in 1844
for the building of a telegraph
line between Washington and
Baltimore, the first in the world.

THE END OF TUBERCULOSIS

Tuberculosis and Orphanage.
BY MISS ETHEL VAN BENTHUYZEN.
In Troy 32 per cent of the children in the orphanage lost their parents by tuberculosis, and they were exposed to it from the cradle. In Albany 42 per cent of the children in our orphanage are likely to fall down with the disease. These children not only have to start life dependents, but are likely to fall down with the struggle to be self supporting. Here is dependency caused not by the spirit of pauperism; here are human lives made ineffective simply by the direct and deadly work of the tubercle bacillus.

Where Girls Should Stay.

I receive many letters from girls, who seem to have one paramount problem, how to earn a living. The multitude of them want city life, although few have a special training to fit for it.
When a girl asks for counsel—there is only one brand of advice to offer. First let her make a beginning in her own community. No matter how small her town is, there is sure to be a little store where she can get some idea of business. A year or two spent in waiting on customers, in making change and caring for bills runs off considerable of the rawness which is a handicap in the city. She can qualify as a stenographer in the office of some country lawyer or village factory. She can learn telegraphy or shorthand, or learn to train the millinery work, or journalism. The superintendent of schools in a large city tells me that some of his best teachers were girls who had taught for several terms in country schools. They were healthier, less frazzled of nerve, and had more endurance than the city-bred girls. A city hospital recruits, when possible, from nurses who have been trained in a village school. A New York physician declares he prefers a country-bred nurse to the woman who has never been out of her own town. A city physician declares he prefers a steady hand and steady nerves—Isabel Gordon Curtis in Success Magazine.
