TEN CENT TROLLEY FARE

Every witness for the Company has admitted that trolley traffic is constantly increasing and we would be satisfied to have that as a basis. On the Manchester line the riding is heavy and constant the whole year around, so much so that the company cannot handle the traffic a great deal of the time...

CONSIDER LOCAL ONLY. The question is further clouded by the fact that the Manchester line is now part of a component system. The company would have you take into consideration the whole system. We claim that the line in question should only be taken into consideration if it can be shown that the whole system is a unit and that the Manchester line is a part of it.

BASES OF AGREEMENT. The question now before your honor is a case of first impression. The petitioners claim that the question is a difficult one to decide and that the commission has not in this respect any rule to guide them. At this juncture the company and the petitioner split the difference and the question is left to be decided by the commission.

THE PHYSICAL VALUE. It is to be taken into account, then we claim that we should not be compelled to pay a rate of fare which will not cover our cost and give us a reasonable profit. The rule of thumb, so artlessly propounded by Mr. Levy and all true questions on trolley lines are immediately settled.
