## NET GRAND LIST

OVER SEVENTEEN AND ONE THIRD MILLIONS OF DOLLARS THIS YEAR

An Increase of Over One Million Dollars Over Last Year—Board of Relief Made Exemptions of Over Fifty-Four Thousand Dollars.

The board of relief finished its work last evening and a list of tax exemptions appears below. While the board made some exemptions to the list it also made some additions. It was found that some of the taxpayers had failed to make out their lists and the board of relief had made out lists for them. The additions amount to \$3,906.

The board was required to do some extra work this year on account of the new law relating to the property of old soldiers. The law called for the removal of the exemption of taxes on \$1,000 worth of property of the veterans and substituting a pension of \$30 a year for the old soldiers. The attorney general notified the board to grant the exemption as heretofore, as the new law would in all probability prove unconstitutional. The exemption on the list of 49 old soldiers amounts to \$45,058.

It was found that two lists had been put in twice one amounting to \$165 and the other to \$342.

The total net grand list this year now stands at \$17,308,060. With a tax of eight mills this will raise \$188,416.64. Last year's grand list was \$16,946,477 and \$129,971.81 was raised on same. The net grand list this year is in excess of last year's list by \$1,060,908. The exemptions made were as follows:

Why \$1000 Exemption Was Taken Off Veteran Tax List

If you will kindly allow me space I will try to answer Mr. Loomis' and explain to your readers, who might think the assessors were trying to deprive the old soldiers of something that is justly theirs, why the \$1000 exemption was taken off. He is right when he says taxes are laid from October 1st. If he will look at the books he will see that every old soldier was exempt \$1000 at that time. Then came a possibility that the Supreme Court decision would make the new law Constitutional. The assessors not wishing to put an obstacle in the way of the veterans getting \$80, instead of \$8, as at present, put the exemption back in the lists with the understanding that there was no court decision before March 1 the Board of Relief would make the exemption of \$1,000. Mr. Loomis mourns because the assessors and collector get too much pay and says the assessors get more than some farmers do in a year. Mr. J. H. Hale once said farming was a highly good business because a man could not live at any other business by doing as few days work as some farmers did. As a rule people who want information about taxes go to the assessors office instead of the newspaper. Mr. Loomis is not a stranger to it—it cannot be he does not know the way. 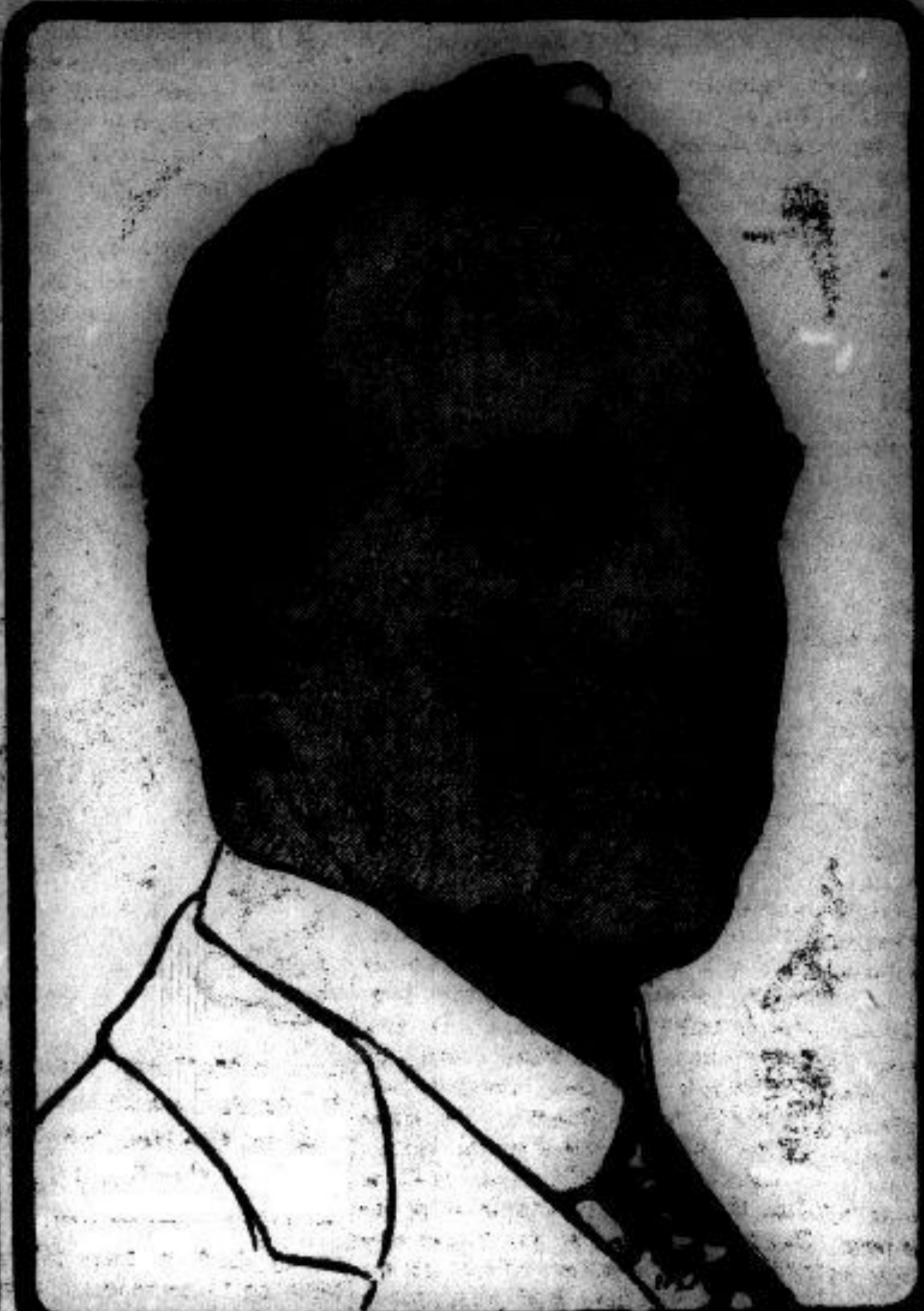

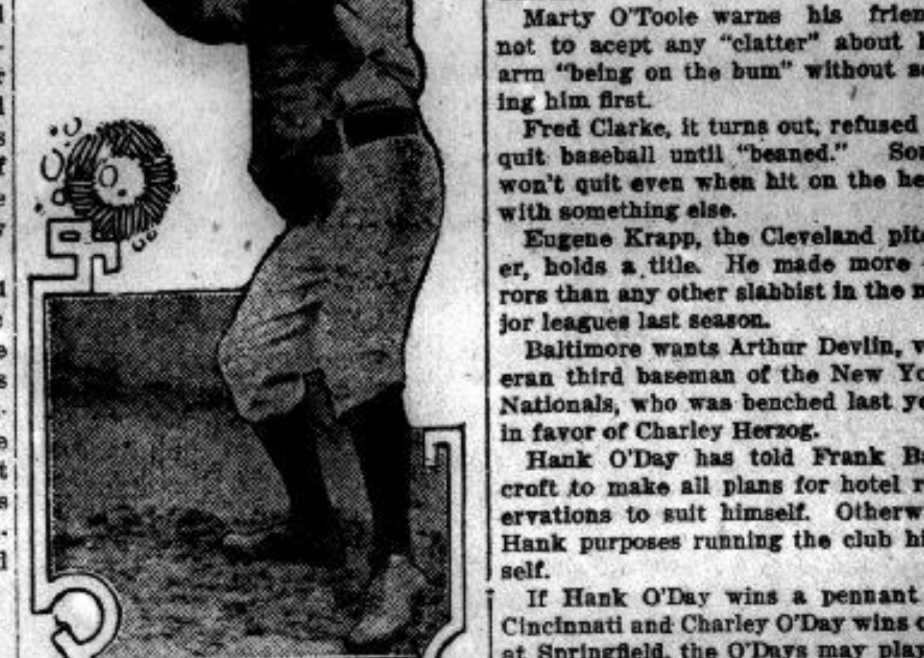
