PAstry.
By Nicolas Seyer, Chef de Brochet Club, London.
Pastry, cakes and sweetmeats generally are wonderfully improved by being cooked in paper bags. The concentration of heat which is thus gained has the effect of making the puff paste lighter and more regular in texture and all cake mixtures "rise" in a manner the oven cannot produce. Then again the cooking takes much less time, and I need not point out the value of this. In the old style the oven door had frequently to be opened to watch progress. The pastry was thus exposed to draughts of cool air, which could but produce "doughy," heavy and unsatisfactory results.

Puff Pastry. Take one pound flour, three-quarters of a pound butter, and mix the flour with water and salt lightly, to the consistency of butter. Leave this dough for half an hour, then flatten it with your hand, and lay your butter on top of the paste. Then fold four-corner way, and give it two rolls as usual. Leave your paste in a cool place for forty-five minutes, then roll twice more. Leave it for forty-five minutes, and roll twice again. Place it in a larger paper bag than will not touch the paste. Put on broiler and allow twenty minutes in a hot oven. (Copyright, 1911, by Sturgis & Walton Company.)

WAYS OF USING MUTTON.
In small places during the cold weather mutton is hard to buy; but a few recipes will be useful when the next is more plentiful.

Shepherd Pie.—Take a pound of cold mutton, a pint of cold-boiled potatoes, one-half an onion grated, one two cooked carrots; cut the mutton and potatoes into small pieces and put them with the onion and carrot into a deep baking dish. Add a cupful of stock or water, salt, pepper and a tablespoonful of butter cut in bits. Pare and boil four medium-sized potatoes, mash and add cup of cream, salt and pepper to taste, beat until light, then add enough flour to make a soft dough; roll out and cover the dish with the dough, make a cross cut in the center to allow the steam to escape, and bake in a moderate oven one hour.

Barbecued Mutton.—Make a sauce by melting two tablespoonsful of butter; to this add the juice of half a lemon, a quarter of glass of cranberry jelly, one-quarter of a teaspoonful of mustard, one-half teaspoonful of salt, pepper to taste and a bit of grated orange peel. Rub slices of mutton in this sauce and serve hot. Do not cook after getting hot, or it will toughen the meat.

Muttons au Gratin.—Mix together the following ingredients: Two cups of cooked macaroni, three cups of cold cooked mutton, one-half cup of strained tomato, one teaspoonful of curry powder, one egg, one and a half tablespoonsful of butter, salt and pepper to taste. Butter a deep pie plate or baking dish, make a mound of the mixture and cover thickly with crumbs, well buttered; cover the pan and cook twenty minutes, then uncover and garnish with sprigs of parsley.

Croquettes are fine made from mutton, using curry for flavoring or a little tobacco and Worcestershire sauce.

Health Hint for Today.
Water With Meals.
A difference of opinion has existed as to whether water should be drunk with food. Recent experiments have seemed to indicate that water may be drunk with benefit at mealtime. This is not finally settled, but it is certain that the practice of following a bit of food immediately with a mouthful of water or other liquid, washing it down with proper mastication and mixture with the saliva, is injurious. Children should especially be trained to avoid this habit. There is no doubt that in a case in which food is imperfectly masticated, the drinking of a moderate amount of water shortly after eating would facilitate digestion, but the bit and sup habit is obviously bad.
