DIRECT PRIMARY

GEORGE H. HOWE WINS NOMINATION FOR TAX COLLECTOR

Cook Wins Over Toop for Representative—Willard R. Rogers Wins Place on Republican Ticket for Selectman—Sweet and Little Lose Nominations

Tuesday was primary day in town and the day was filled with getting out a good sized vote. The contests for selection, collector of taxes, constable and representatives interested the voters most and the candidates kept pretty busy getting out their friends to the polls. The main items of the day centered in the fight for the nomination of tax collector and when the final count had been made it showed that Selectman George H. Howe had finished at the head of the list with a total vote of 198. Samuel Smith gave Mr. Howe a good run for the honors and was only four votes behind.

Representative Willard R. Rogers, Arthur B. Keeney who held the office of collector for a number of years and who was also in the running again for the office, were the only other candidates who entered the contest late had 100 loyal supporters.

These were all on the republican list.

Several important contests were the three contested fight for representative on the republican ticket. William S. Hyde was a candidate for nomination and selection. Arthur B. Keeney and Oliver F. Toop were also entered in the contest. Mr. Hyde led easily with 77 votes. Mr. Toop polled 54 and Mr. Keeney 35. The contest for place on the republican side of the board of selectmen also attracted considerable interest. There were nine candidates and but five could be nominated. Anolis Cheney was given 729 votes. Howard I. Taylor 709, Lawrence W. Case 692, Gilbert B. Willis 484 and Willard B. Rogers 431.

The polls were closed at eight o'clock and the counting started. It was nearly half past eleven before Moderator Charles R. Hathaway announced the result.

The democratic vote was counted last. There were 45 ballots cast of which 37 were thrown out. The remaining 8 ballots were cast straight. The socialist polled 3 straight ballots. The republican polled 191 votes and 29 were thrown out for various reasons. Following is a list of the results of the day voting:

Burning Ballots

A great deal of criticism is being heard hereabouts because Town Clerk Bradford M. Benton burned the ballots last Wednesday afternoon, which were cast at the Direct Primary here last week Tuesday, September 17th.

Samuel Smith, who was defeated in the direct primary by four votes for the office of Collector of Taxes asked for and was given permission by the moderator, Charles R. Hathaway, to have a record of the ballots. This was by the agreement to have taken place Tuesday afternoon. Alvin W. Greene and Thomas D. Faulkner were decided upon to make the record and accepted the responsibility. They did not present themselves at the Town Clerk's office Tuesday afternoon and had official burned the ballots Wednesday morning. The counters called Wednesday afternoon to do the counting but there were no ballots to count. When it was found that the ballots did not call at the Hall of Records Tuesday, as agreed, it was apparently taken for granted by Mr. Benton and by Mr. Hathaway that the record was abandoned and Mr. Hathaway told Mr. Benton he could make such disposition of the ballots as he saw fit. Mr. Benton did it very promptly—as noted above.

The opportunity to count the ballots was permitted to pass by Mr. Smith's friends but they were aggrieved because of this occurrence.

There is no time limit specified in the Direct Primary Act under which the ballots may or may not be destroyed. It is quite likely that an amendment to the Act may be presented to the next legislature setting a reasonable and definite time after the ballots may be destroyed.

In view of the past performance under the direct primary here regarding the destruction of the ballots, the act is to be taken to the rank and file of the voters rather precipitate to say the least.

As an extenuating circumstance it is pleaded that the ballots were to be used for the town election Monday, October 7th. As that date is almost two weeks distant from the date of the burning of the ballots it certainly is a mooted question how much that circumstance excuses.

Wouldn't you say that any grave injustice could have been done anyone had the ballots been preserved at least one day longer. Certainly by doing a great deal of dissimulation would have been alleged and the Square Deal of which we hear so much would have been exemplified.

Bridge Now in Use

The new railroad bridge now spans West Center street along the tracks of the South Manchester railroad and the old stone abutments have been removed. The stone has been widened there and the new bridge rests upon huge concrete piers. It eliminates a dangerous spot along the road and affords a wide and safe passage to the public square. The space between the old abutments and the trolley cars was dangerous and the bridge was a constant menace to the safety of the public. The change from the old to the new bridge was made last Sunday. One of the boys, most of the children of the bridge—the west one—weighs 15 tons and the other—the east one—weighs 18 tons. It required some engineering skill to get them so carefully and safely in place. The traveling electric crane owned by Chesey Brothers was employed for this work. In looking the bridge over the boys and children of the bridge were very much interested in the big girder and it was safely lifted off the car and lowered into place. Many persons watched the work there during most of the day.

Other years the voters are made in time for the October election. Manchester having over 10,000 will not make voters until the latter part of October.
