The United States, according to Government statistics, drank in 1911 more whiskey per capita than was ever drunk before in this country...

The well meaning but bigoted advocates of prohibition are responsible for the increased drunkenness in this country. THEY HAVE CAUSED IT.

Formerly in the United States drunkenness was much more widespread than at present. At that time the national drink was whiskey made of corn or rye.

The abolition of the saloons in our army homes for old soldiers and elsewhere has, as every officer in the army knows, increased drunkenness and desertion.

In the saloons only the lightest, most temperate alcoholic drinks were served. The saloons were the soldier's club.

Prohibition has increased the amount of drunkenness in the United States. Prohibition has succeeded in injuring the sale of harmless drinks.

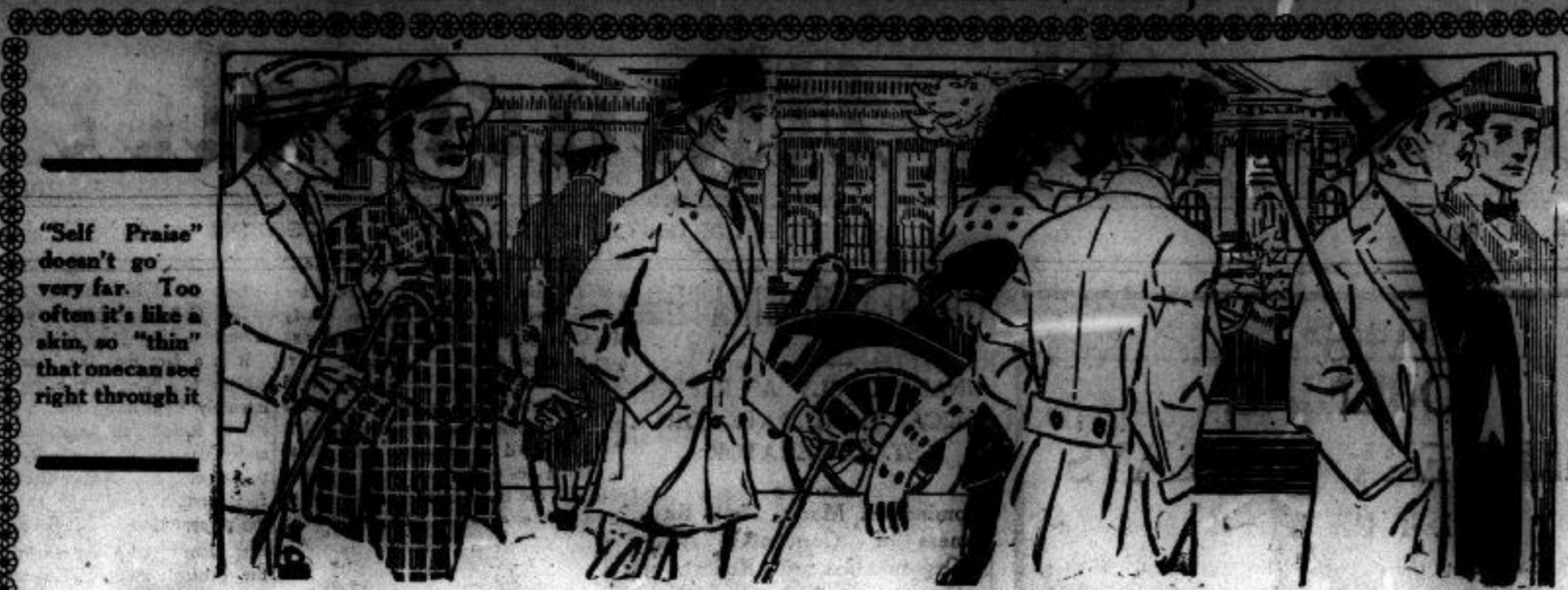

Does Manchester Need the Saloon for Revenue

Saloons Decrease the Productive Power of Manchester Many do not work at all because of the saloons. Many can do only the most simple work because of the saloons.

Who Pays The License Fee? 12 saloons in Manchester pay \$450 each for a total of \$5400. What does the town give the saloons?

\$54000 The People of Manchester Pay the license fees into the saloons before the saloons pay it back to the town.

\$24,000 The average saloon keeper must in addition to his license fees receive at least \$2000 for his expenses of help, rent, other expenses and private profit.

\$29,400 Allowing the saloon keeper a profit of 50% on the liquor sold, their expense for liquor would be as much as the two above items or \$29,400.

\$38,800 Total. So a conservative estimate is that these people pay into our saloons \$60,000 at least and perhaps \$100,000 a year and in ten years between \$60,000 and \$1,000,000.

\$5130 If we receive in return \$5400, 5% of which must be paid to the state, we are paying out \$11 for each dollar returned to the town.

Vote the Saloon Out of Town Saloons Lessen the Amount of Taxable Property. The more property there is to be assessed the lighter the tax rate will be.
