FIXING RATES UNDER PARCEL POST SYSTEM

Government Goes Into Business of Transmitting Merchandise Through the Mails.

NEW LAW FULLY EXPLAINED

Country Divided into Zones and Units for Purpose of Fixing Charge for Carriage—No Package Weighing More Than Eleven Pounds Allowed to Carry Anything Properly Wrapped Which Will Injure Other Mail if Not Secured.

With the coming of the New Year the United States government will enter into a new field of enterprise—the transmission of merchandise by parcel post. For years there has been a demand for such a system of inexpensive transmission of packages. The parcel post law, which was passed in 1906, and which was amended in 1909, 1910, 1911 and 1912, has now been amended so that it will be in effect on January 1, 1913.

RATES OF POSTAGE

Parcels weighing four ounces or less are mailable at the rate of one cent for each ounce or fraction of an ounce, regardless of distance. JOHNSON PACKAGE BILL

NEW LAW EFFECTING FOOD PRODUCTS GOES INTO EFFECT JAN. 11

All Package Goods Sold in the State Must Have Net Contents Placed on Outside—Law Applies to Milk Sold in Bottles, Alas, Wines, Etc.

The law relating to the sale of package goods in the state of Connecticut introduced by Representative Aaron Johnson of this town at the last session of the General Assembly and passed by that body becomes a law one week from tomorrow.

The law will become effective at that time. The law went into effect in reality on its approval June 11, 1911, but it was supposed to be in effect for a year.

That the bill covers a wide field is being found out as the general public is looking into it in more detail.

For instance all milk bottles will have to be labeled with the net contents of the bottles, as will also liquid sold in bottles by cases.

The law applies to foods, as that defined in Chapter 553 of the Public Acts of 1907.
