FAVOR MANAGERS WHO PLAY
Dish Owners Are Said to Have Little Use for "Bunch" Directors—Kilmer Worried Hard.
Baseball owners are of the opinion that a playing manager is of greater value to a club than one who directs from the bench. In choosing a manager they usually strive to get one who can participate actively in the contests throughout the season. Charlie Doolin, manager of the Philadelphia National League team, holds the belief that while a playing manager may be preferable, he ought not to be a catcher, as Mr. Doolin is. It will be remembered that Doolin did little catching last season. He was out for a while owing to an injured leg, but allowed Kilmer to do most of the catching even when he was in condition. Doolin also is credited with the statement that a catcher should be a manager. He declares that a young pitcher cannot do himself justice with the director behind the plate. In striking a ball to demonstrate to the chief what he possesses in the way of speed he often outdoes himself, consequently hitting to get the best results. Doolin has liked it this way while catching the youngsters, and therefore allowed Kilmer to do the catching nearly all the time.

WASHINGTON TEAM EXPECTED TO DO BIG FIGURE IN AMERICAN LEAGUE
Owing to the success which the Washington club has had this year it is the opinion of many that the team will be a more dangerous factor for the championship of the American League in 1913 than it has been in 1912. This is the first season in which Washington has been a contender in the Junior organization. The Washington club has traveled along the side streets, peering out now and then to watch the big show. Grith has a team which is composed of some very good material, some average material and no material which is really first class. He is able to "hit up" a little strength in one or two positions between the lines and the beginning of the next season he may expect the fight with the spring with a formidable aggregation. Another fact to be considered in regard to the chances of the Washington team next year is that the team will not start with mild curiosity as to its future. The players have found that they can win, and if they get a good training season they are likely to step out in front at the drop of the hat and make everybody come to them. Johnson will probably be assisted by a better pitching staff than operated with him this year, and that is going to add to the success of the team. If Johnson had a running mate who was the same type as himself, the Washingtons might have won the championship this year. It is a fact that they were outplayed in some other departments of the field. Their defense would have been so strong that they could have made two or three runs to a game, or perhaps even a better margin than that, would have pushed them out in front.
