

> TESTS HEAT OF THE FURNACE Pyrometer Measures the Tem-

No thermometer could ever be exfurnaces or of great masse of molten metal, although the development of science along certain lines has made it very necessary to determine the degree of heat in furnaces and contained in masses of metal, such as huge steel billets and great cubes of iron.

The discovery that two different kinds of metal welded together produced a current of electricity was the means of inventing a means of determining the quantity of heat, no matter how intense. The current is measured by voltage and certain tempers tures produce certain values in electrical strength, and that is the way the amount of heat is measured. The electrical energy is measured in degrees of heat, and this has been found

The principle is applied in a wonderful device known as the radiation pyrometer. It can stand at a considerable distance from the furnace or mass of molten metal that is being tested and it will record the internal heat conditions accurately.
