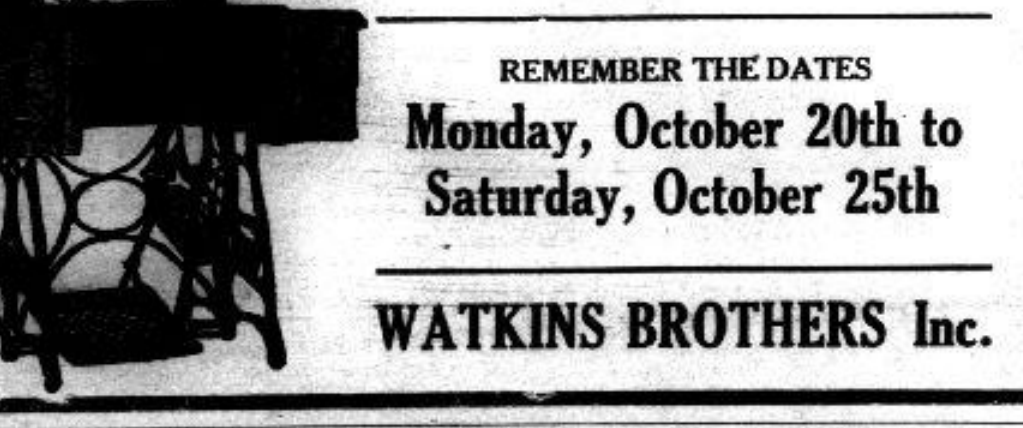

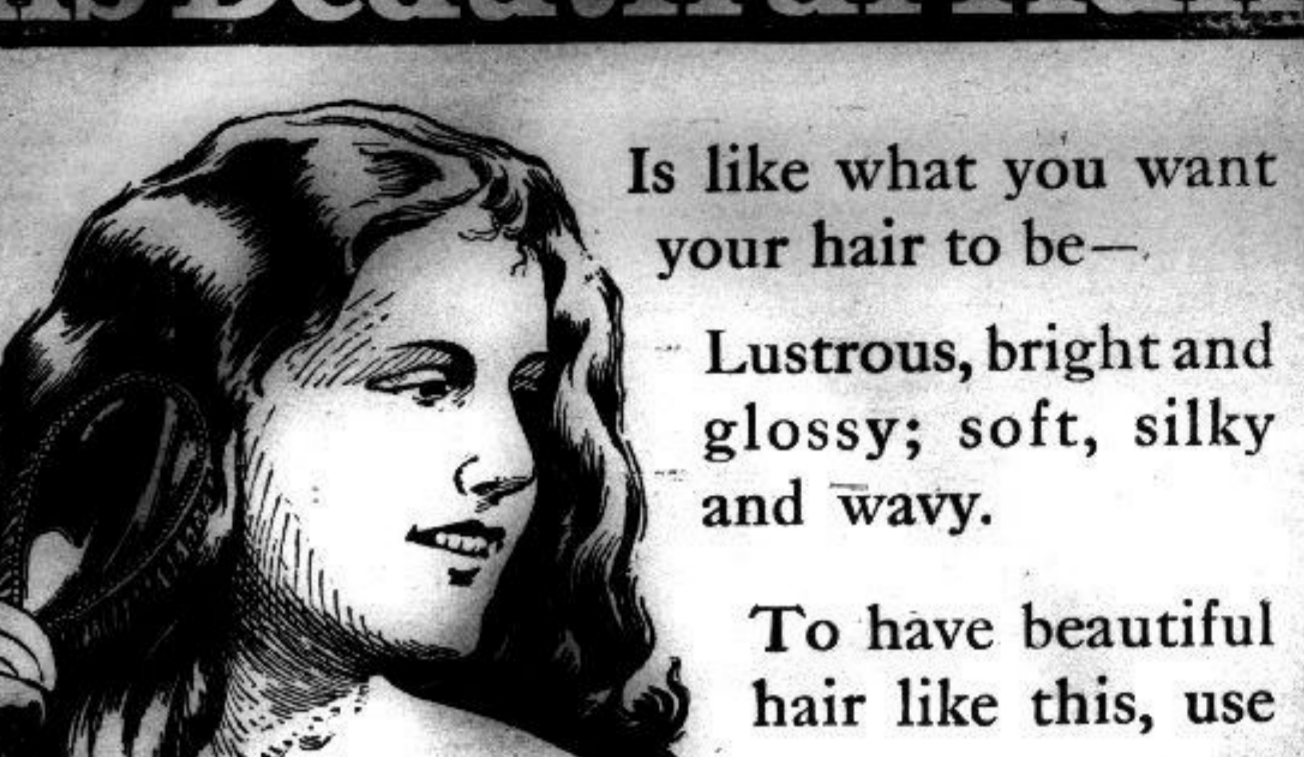

WHAT WHEN AND HOW TO EAT

Proper Feeding Saves Lives of Thousands of Children.

By EUGENE CHRISTIAN, F. S. D.

Over 30,000 children die in the United States every year from preventable diseases. Most of these, it is true, are due to two years of age, but this furnishes plenty good evidence that vast army of little fellows merge from infancy into youth every year who have barely escaped the grave.

In the city of New York alone 20,700 children under two years of age die every year from what might also be termed "preventable diseases." Most of these deaths occur during the months of July and August last year 2,888 children under two years of age died in that city from diarrhoeal diseases alone—that is to say, of intestinal trouble, which, in its last stages, means wrong eating.

It is fair to assume that mothers in New York city know as much about feeding as do the mothers in other American cities—in other words, it is reasonable to conclude that mothers in other American cities are as ignorant on this question as are the mothers in New York. This being true, it is

intention can be kept in normal condition the child like any other little animal, will thrive even under many adverse conditions. The normal and healthy action of the stomach and alimentary tract depends entirely upon the child's food and drink; therefore child feeding is in truth the key to child health and life.

This life saving work among children can be accomplished by teaching nursing mothers, first, how to feed themselves and, second, if the baby is bottle fed, how to prepare and modify as humanized cow's milk, which is a very cheap and simple process. This is a thing that every mother would willingly do for her child if she knew how. The responsibility, therefore, for this tremendous suffering and loss of infant life is thrown back upon us, who do know and who are able to teach and distribute simple information, so that every mother who feeds her child will be able to do so in the most intelligent and healthful manner.

Volunteers have been written upon the subject of infant feeding. Laborious analyses have been made. The results are compiled; terms in chemistry have been severely drawn upon to explain the findings of scientists. The efforts of all these writers, no doubt, were inspired by the noblest purpose. Nevertheless, amid their tabular and scientific details, they have averaged more than bewildered and must perform turns back to common sense, experience and motherly instinct. It is here that every mother should have some knowledge of the chemistry of common food. She should know something about selecting and combining such things as are in chemical harmony. She should know something about the requirements of the infant body and in what particular respect it differs from that of the adult.

Every mother should know how to feed her baby so as to nourish her baby from the breast if possible, but if this cannot be done an artificial feeding becomes necessary. The preparation of baby food becomes of great importance. Cow's milk, of course, is the logical substitute for mother's milk, but taken whole or natural, it is too high in proteins and too low in sugar; therefore, in order to make a healthy baby food, it must be modified according to the requirements of the infant body.

Formula For Humanizing Cow's Milk. The nurse or mother should prepare an amount sufficient for only one day's supply at a time after the following formula:

Formula for the fifth to the twelfth month: Cream 2 1/2 ounces Milk 2 1/2 ounces Water 2 1/2 ounces Sugar 1/2 level teaspoonful Lactogen 1/2 level teaspoonful
