FIRE PUMP TEST
BIG SEAGRAVES AUTO FIRE PUMP SHOWN HERE

Powerful Apparatus Attracts Many Onlookers. Two Streams Eighty Feet High—Draws Water From Sluiceway At Goulds Pond

There was a demonstration of the capabilities of an automobile fire pump in this place last Monday afternoon when a big Seagraves apparatus was driven into town and demonstrated. The test was held at the suggestion of Frank Cheney, Jr., president of the South Manchester Fire department. The fire commission of the district, comprising Messrs. Cheney, E. L. G. Bohlen, secretary, and E. S. Watkins, treasurer, the new apparatus committee of Messrs. Ladd, Ladd, Ladd, and Ladd, comprising Harry M. Burke, Hector West and William Taylor, as well as local firemen, men, women and a throng of school children, gathered to witness the demonstration.

The machine that was used in the test is one that has been in the East giving demonstrations in different parts of the country. It weighs about 1,000 pounds and is a combination of a fire engine and a water pump. It is a big machine and has a power plant that will draw from both a hydrant and a water main. The pump apparatus is installed in the rear of the driver's seat and the power for the pump is furnished from the engine which runs the machine. A lever through the gears into mesh with the pump and the speed of the pump is controlled from the driving wheel. There is a suction pipe to the rear and six outlet pipes from the pump allowing for three fire hose couplings to be used at one time, or two couplings may be used and six streams of water may be thrown. The pump can either be connected with a fire hydrant, or it can suck water from a river, brook or pond. When water is to be drawn from a hydrant, a six inch suction pipe is used. When taken from a fire hydrant a single line of hose from the hydrant to the pump is used. When taken from a river or brook, a six inch suction pipe is used. The machine cost \$10,000. No fire hose is carried but a company could arrange a place for carrying same in the rear of the machine.

HOW TO START AN APPLE ORCHARD
The Points That Mean Success or Failure.

The first thing to do in starting an apple orchard is to select the best place. While apple trees will grow almost anywhere, they will thrive and produce fine fruit only on such soil and in such location as are best suited to them.

The best land for apple trees is the rolling upland that lies at an elevation of from 400 to 2,000 feet above sea level. On land of this character trees are far more healthy and will be less subject to diseases. There is also less danger from late spring frosts.

The kind of soil is the next most important thing. If possible this should be somewhat heavy loam, with enough clay in it to make it hold water in times of heavy rains. A soil that is made from limestone is best for fruit trees.

WINTER DAIRYING PAYS
More Than Twice the Profit That the Summer Dairymen Can Make.
By C. B. LAINE,
Assistant Chief of Dairy Division, Department of Agriculture.

The dairy cow of today is largely an artificial product. The application of science in breeding, feeding and care has developed her from an animal producing a few quarts of milk to sustain her young to an animal that produces sixty quarts of milk in a day.

One of the essential things in securing a large yearly record is "fall freshening," which enables the dairymen to produce a large flow of milk in the fall. The claim is sometimes made that good feed stuffs are too expensive in winter to produce milk at a profit. This is not true, and we have only to investigate the work of the dairymen who follow all the year round dairying to substantiate the fact that they are making the most money.

With the sale and an abundance of alfalfa hay, milk can be produced on thousands of farms almost as cheaply in winter as in summer and in nearly as large quantities. The increase in the value of winter milk is goodly, set by the increase in price.

To compare the fall and spring milk, the farmer with twelve cows had them all come in fresh in the spring, when the price of milk was 12 cents per quart. In the fall they were all dry with the exception of three, and they were strikers. He was driving two calves to the creamery every day in the middle of December with twenty quarts of milk when the creamery was offering high prices. Half half of his cows freshened in the fall he should have been having 100 quarts of milk instead of twenty.

Another dairymen in the same state was conducting his dairy in a directly opposite way. This man had twelve cows in the fall, and he was producing milk in December as when his cows were in grass. He was shipping about 250 quarts of milk per day from twenty-two cows, and his milk check for the month was \$100. The value of "winter dairying" may be stated briefly as follows:

First—Cows produce more milk and butter during the winter than during the summer. The milk is sweeter and the butter is richer. The winter milk is kept longer and the summer milk is not so good.

Was the north in favor of the abolition of slavery prior to the civil war? If so, why were Wendell Phillips and Lloyd Garrison mobbed for advocating it?

Prior to and during the first years of the war the sentiment in the north was in favor of the abolition of slavery. Many people, while opposed to slavery, were equally opposed to interference with the rights of the southern slaveholders. Others tacitly favored the extension of slavery rather than its abolition. It was those last probably that instigated the attacks on Phillips and Garrison in Boston and other places, as both of them were leaders of the so-called "abolition party" and prominent in the movement to do away with slavery.

Did the platform of the Republican party in the campaign which culminated in the election of Abraham Lincoln advocate the abolition of slavery? Not specifically, although many abolitionists were enrolled under the party banner. The platform, however, did contain a plank unqualifiedly opposing the "extension" of slavery in any form, and the prevailing sentiment of the north at that time was in favor of the abolition of slavery.

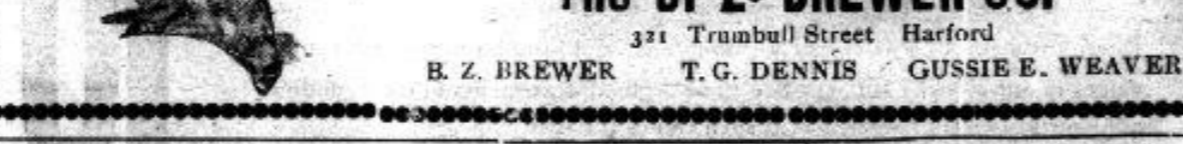

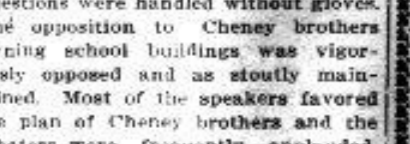
