### WORK STARTED

Edgerton Street Being Extended Northward. E. C. Hillard has set a body of men at work making an extension of Edgerton street whereby an opening may be effected across Bigelow Brook to the intersection of Hemlock street. Trees are being cut down at the north end of Edgerton street and the driveway on the south side of Bigelow Brook is being filled in there to make room for the highway that is to skirt the north boundary of the newly acquired property of the Manchester Lumber Company at that point. This is considerable a task as the fill is a deep one and will require many cubic yards of earth to make a suitable highway continuing Edgerton street down to the brook. The L. C. Baker Company, as previously mentioned in these columns, has the contract from Mr. Hillard to place a new and suitable culvert across Bigelow Brook at a point just west of the tracks of the South Manchester Railroad Company and adjacent to same. Up to the present time there is no northward opening for Edgerton street but this short coming is to be remedied as soon as the work can be done. This latter depends somewhat upon the sort of weather that may be vouchsafed us. In any case the completion of the work is now an assured fact and will be a means of great relief for people residing north of Bigelow Brook on Hemlock street, Bigelow street and adjoining thoroughfares, as it will give them a short cut to the silk mills.

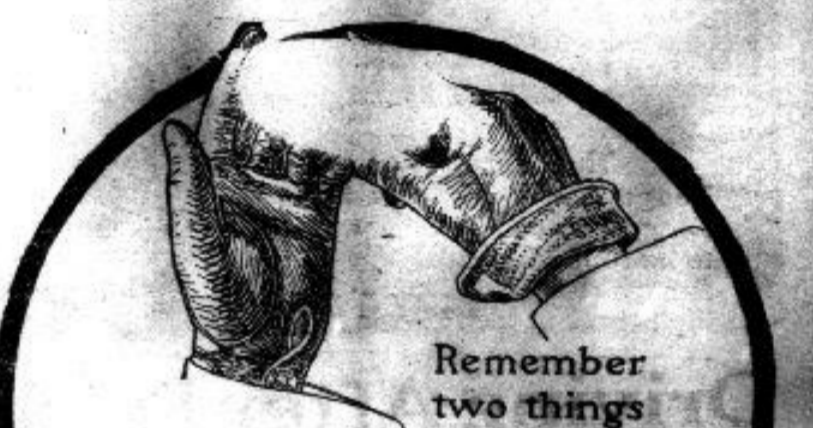

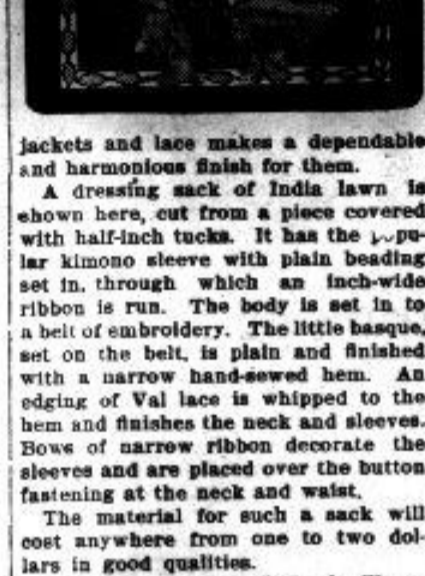

WHAT, WHEN AND HOW TO EAT

Things That Produce Health and Prevent Disease. Article No. 2.

By EUGENE CHRISTIAN, F. S. D.

THE old dietary standards which have been published for many years by the national scientific standpoint somewhat misleading. They merely record the average amount of food eaten by the several classes of people under observation while performing a certain amount of kind of labor. The mistake that these so-called standards assume that the food eaten was the best food that could be procured. They took all the errors that the average man makes in selecting, combining and proportioning his food and undertook to standardize them. I assume that they considered these diets correct, as it is hardly possible to find a better diet than the one that the average man eats.

and good stimulation of waste, just as the automobile motor in order to develop power must have a good quality of gasoline and a good method of getting rid of waste products. If there is congestion throughout the body in the form of colds, rheumatism, gout, indigestion and that "tired feeling" which is so familiar to most people, a large percentage of energy must be devoted to relieving the body of poisons caused by these congested conditions. This is the reason why everything we take into the body should be pure and have some natural energizing effect. This is also the reason why the food question is today one of the most important problems.

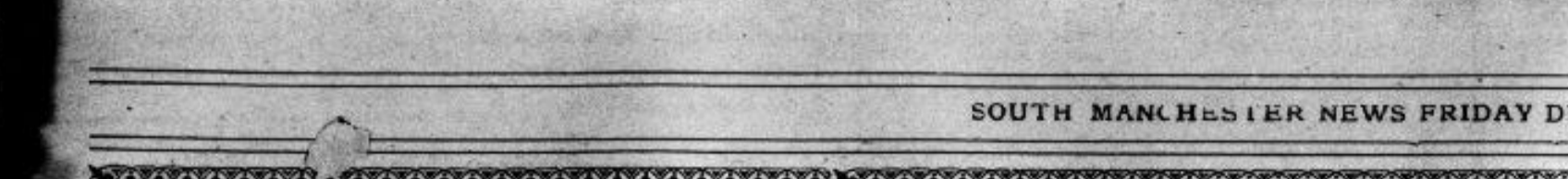

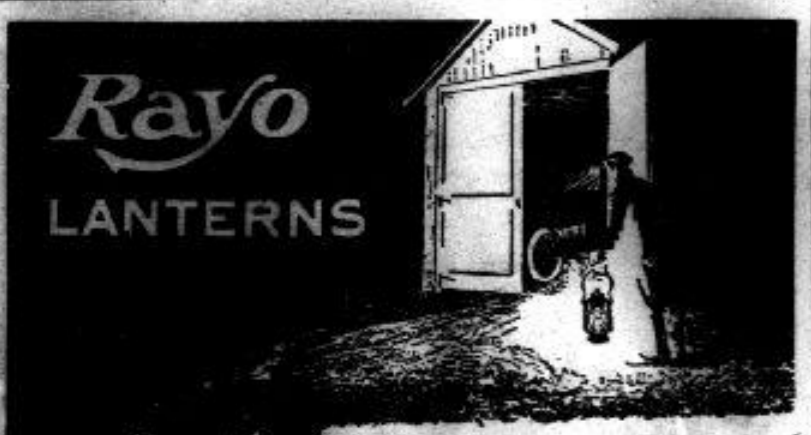

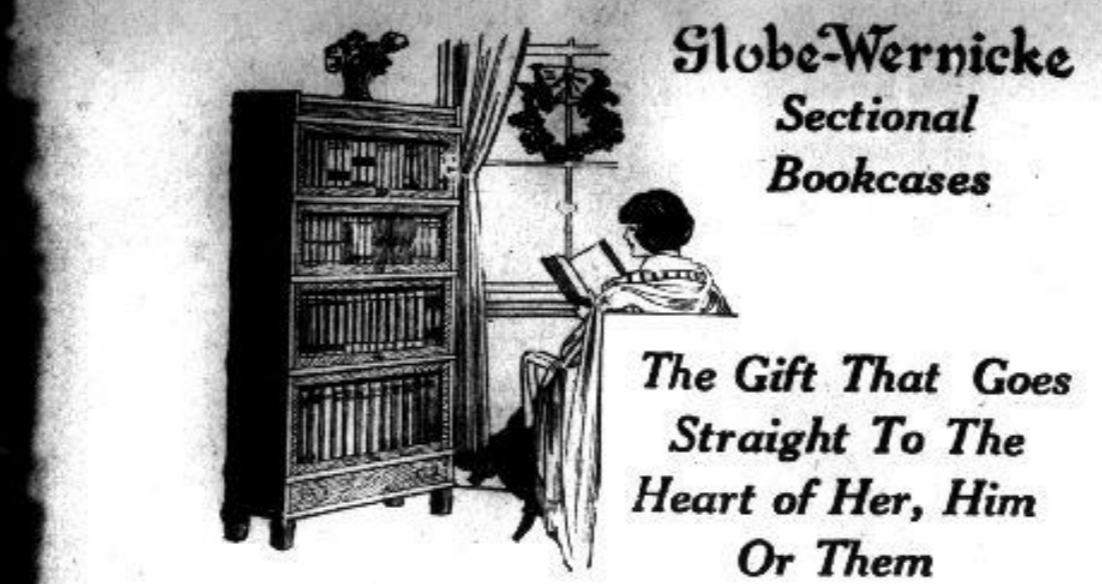
### Death From Diphtheria

### FIRE LAST NIGHT

#### SOUTH MANCHESTER POST OFFICE IMPERILED BUT FORTUNATELY SAVED AS FIRE BURNED SLOW

Farr Brothers Lose Entire Fruit and Confectionery Stock—Fixtures in Tiffany's Jewelry Store Damaged—Smith's Clothing, Shoes, Hats and Furnishing Stock Damaged With Water and Smoke—Building Not Greatly Damaged

At 6:30 o'clock last evening fire was discovered in the basement of Farr Brothers confectionery and fruit store in the Cheney Block on Main street in the heat and confusion and within fifteen minutes after the first alarm was rung a general alarm was sounded calling out the entire fire department.

It took two hours to conquer the fire, because it worked its way between the partitions and the metal ceilings and could not be reached readily.

The greatest damage is to the stock and fixtures of Farr Brothers. Tiffany's jewelry store saved the stock but the fixtures are very much damaged. The clothing, shoes, hats, furnishings, etc. of George W. Smith were damaged considerably by smoke and water. So was the postoffice. Upstairs the barber shop of George B. Miner was damaged by water and smoke. The office of Dr. G. W. May, the Elliot Studio, the stock of Nahn & Holleran, milliners, the dental studio of Dr. M. M. Maine, and the furniture of the Orford Social Club all on the second floor were damaged by water and smoke. It is impossible at this writing to accurately estimate the damage done to the building or to the several stocks of merchandise etc.

It would seem now that the stock of Farr Brothers is a total loss. The jewelry stock of Tiffany was placed in the safe before it was much injured. There was no fire in the store of George W. Smith whatsoever. There was plenty of smoke and water, and C. Tiffany will open for business next Monday or Tuesday.

George W. Smith and his staff of clerks are all engaged in cleaning out the store today and getting ready for the adjusters. They expect to re-open next week early with a big smoke and water sale, ample notice of which will be given the public.

It was 45 years ago that the South Manchester postoffice was destroyed by fire at the burning of the old Cheney Block on Main and Charter Oak streets.
