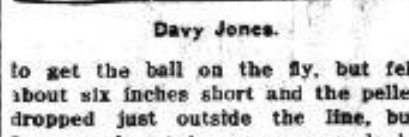

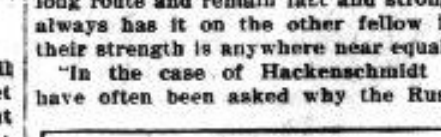
to get the ball on the fly, but fell about six inches short and the pellet dropped just outside the line, but far enough out to remove any doubt in my mind as to its being foul.
