WARNED LAST JANUARY

England's participation in the European conflict was indicated by the Canadian parliament. In the house of commons and in the senate party lines disappeared and the address in support of the speech from the throne was adopted in record time.

That Canada was warned in January last that Germany would probably precipitate war was the starting point of the speech from the throne. It cannot overstate the great advantage which resulted to the government from having these matters thought out in advance.

Comander Bound For New York Forced to Stop at Boston

Comander Bound For New York forced to stop at Boston Aug. 21.—With her coal supply nearly exhausted and her smokestack painted battlement gray, the Comander Irons left Boston harbor with more than 800 passengers, after a trying voyage from Rome, Trieste, Naples and Gibraltar.

Throughout the trip from Gibraltar passengers were in a generally nervous state, because of rumors of the presence of German warships in her path, and their discontent was heightened when they learned that the liner was heading for Boston instead of New York, her destination, because of the shortage of coal.

Upon arrival passengers also complained that there had been a shortage of provisions. Rumors of the fifty-sailor saloon passengers, mostly Americans, who had started out of Europe before the European conflict became general. The liner sailed from Rome July 27.

ENGLAND LOST BUT ONE SHIP

Germany's Loss Thus Far Reported to Be Two

WAR RISK RATE LOWERED

German Fleet Confined to Harbor and Military Situation Favorable to Allies According to Official Report of British Foreign Office—French Advancing into Alsace-Lorraine

Washington, Aug. 21.—The British foreign office called the British embassy here the exact naval and military situation between England and Germany. In it it was stated that Germany to date has lost only one light cruiser, while a German submarine and a German mine-layer have been destroyed.

It states that the German fleet outside the Baltic is confined to the harbor, that German sea-borne commerce is paralyzed and that English commerce is practically normal. The statement further says: "Since the declaration of war the fleet has been responsible for the safety of the expeditionary force, which completed its disembarkation in France on Aug. 18, which was effected in perfect order and without a casualty."

"Work of the navy in the Atlantic and elsewhere in safe-guarding the trade routes is best exemplified by the fact that at Lloyds Aug. 19 the war risk rate fell off 40 shillings percent for almost any voyage of British vessels, whereas the rate to insure the freight of corn paid by steamers from the United States to a British port is 30 shillings percent.

"The military position is as follows: The German forces at present extend from the north of the neighborhood of Basle through Liege to a point in Belgium to the east of Antwerp and near the Dutch frontier. The outstanding feature of the operations up to the present has been the delay caused by the contemplated German offensive movement across the Meuse by the defense of Liege, where the forts are still intact.

Upon investigation he found this truck and four others sent with it contained in the aggregate fifty gallons of whiskey. It was found that the peppermit, which was so strong when the trucks were opened as to be almost choking, had intended to disguise the fact which might come from the whiskey in case any of the containers in the trucks should leak.

NEW RULING ON FOOD Spoiled Products Must Hereafter Be "Denatured" Before Shipment

Washington, Aug. 21.—Spoiled food products will have to be denatured before being shipped in interstate commerce in the future under a ruling of the department of agriculture. This will permit the shipment of spoiled eggs for use in tanning and other spoiled substances for the manufacture of fertilizer or oils or greases used in machinery, but will require a denaturing stamp on such articles, which will be made by a government process.

possibly out of date a generation ago, it resisted the German advance for twenty-four days with a Garrison of but one battalion. Little, thoroughly modern in his fortifications, seems to have succumbed after a battle that cost hardly have lasted for two days. Its twenty forts and batteries, covering a sweep of twenty miles about the city, can hardly have been battered into submission in so short a time.

The only possible conjecture that can be made in London is that the Germans have executed such a formidable turning movement to the north that it compelled the garrison to evacuate the forts and fall back to the second line of defense on the boundary. Even this explanation seems untenable and the fate of Lille is the most depressed and the most worrying aspect of the campaign.

No details of the new position taken by the allies has been given out in Paris or London. It is supposed that the defenders of Lille and Valenciennes have retired to the Cambrai-Le Cateau line, about ten miles behind Valenciennes. The defenses here are greatly inferior to those at Lille and Valenciennes.

Longwy's Brave Defense The defense of Longwy afforded a shining contrast to the able capitulation of Lille and the ease with which Namur was isolated. When the suspense of the war has been lifted, the resistance offered by the little antiquated fortress to an over-whelmed force will stand out as one of the heroic features of the war, the bombardment of the little fort on the plateau overlooking the Chiers river.

Smashing Attack of Invaders Proves Successful For Third Time Since Great Battle Begun—Lille and Valenciennes, Vital Keys to Frontier Defense of Paris, Suddenly Capitulate to Enemy—Old-Fashioned Forts at Longwy, With but Few Defenders, Offer Shining Contrast by Resisting Advance Over Three Weeks—Paris Rapidly Being Monstrous—British Marines Landed at Ostend—London Fears Zeppelins

London, Aug. 21.—Another day of disaster has emphasized the inability of the allies to hold back the smashing German attack. Lille and Valenciennes have fallen, leaving the outer line of the French defenses. The British press bureau admits that the fall back owing to the desire of the French military authorities to try to maintain a defense over too great an extent of territory.

This is somewhat bitter than the diplomatic phrasing of the British press bureau's dispatch, but no other meaning can be read into the statement that a certain change in position had been forced upon the British troops owing to the French operations extending over 240 miles of frontier. This is clearly an admission that for the third time since the allies joined in battle with the Germans, they have been driven back.

The news that Longwy had at last succumbed to the German advance has been commented by the French ministry of war. No official admission of the fall of Lille, Valenciennes and Roubaix is an undeniable fact in London that the great industrial center have capitulated. In the case of Roubaix, the surrender is not surprising. German cavalry were reported in the city several days ago, and as Roubaix is an undefended city the entry of a hostile force could not well be resisted.

But with Lille and Valenciennes, the mystery of the sudden capitulation of those vital keys to the frontier defenses of Paris is even more surprising than the quick silencing of the guns of Namur. Valenciennes had capable defenses; Lille was surrounded with brilliant forts and ramparts presumably superior in power to anything in France outside of Paris itself and Longwy was a strong fortress.

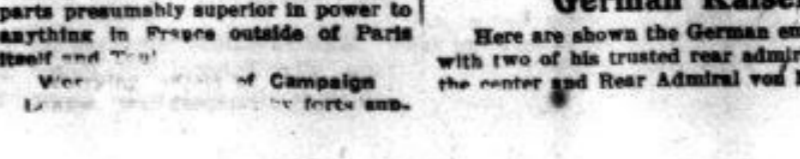

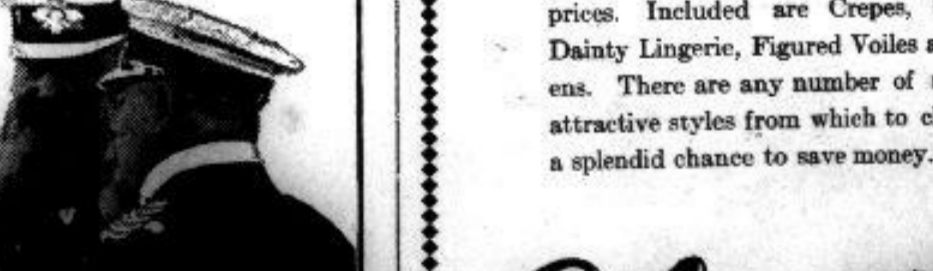
