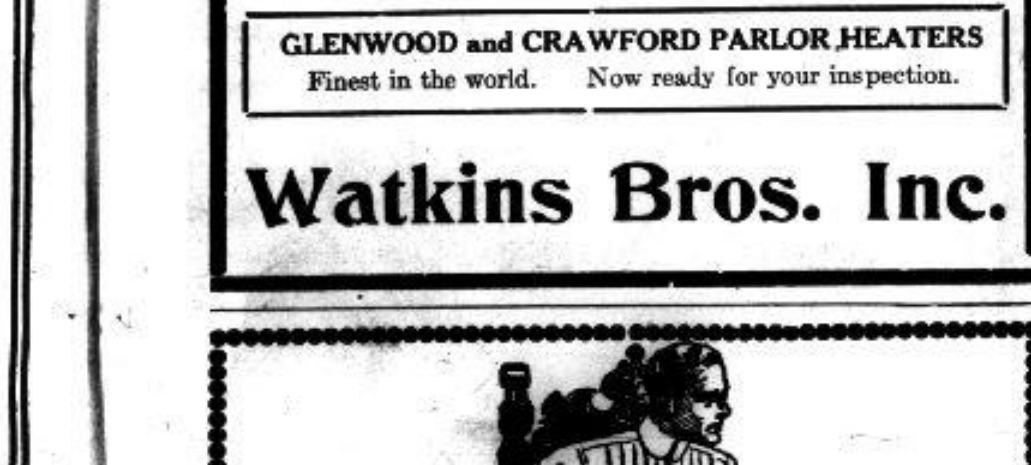

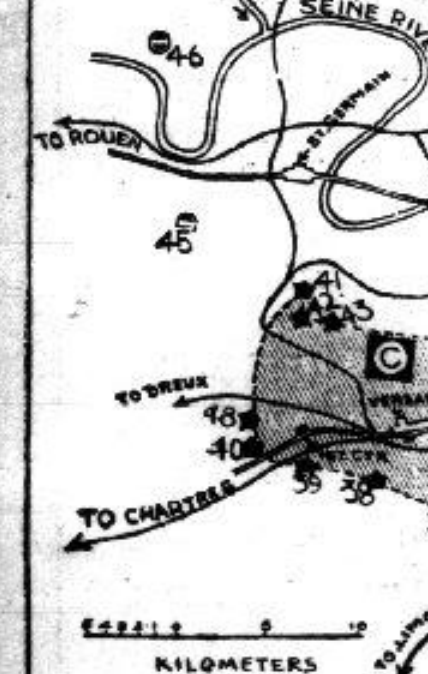
French Capital Has Triple Row of Defenses.

TAUGHT BY FORMER SIEGE.

City's Defenders Believe Present Fortifications Are Greater and More Powerful in Every Way Than Those Which Fall to Germans in Franco-Prussian War—Number of Details of Armament Have Been Closely Held by Military Authorities.

WHEN the approach of the Germans to Paris, the capital of France, through Belgium and northern France became threatening the fortifications of Paris and their ability to resist a siege received the close attention of military authorities.

Paris has been the unannounced objective of the German army since the French ministry of war has adopted urgent means of strengthening the city's defenses to the utmost.

strength. They recognize the Paris defenses as among the strongest fortifications in the world.

Immediately after the signature of peace of 1871 General Rivara reorganised the Paris defenses and constructed the second line of forts which have since been constructed outside the defensive line which resisted the German attack in 1870.

The German soldiers, upon approaching Paris, will find all the positions they took up in 1870 now occupied by French defense works.

The new first line forts are in striking contrast with those of the second line, which were built in 1840, though they have been brought up to date and the location has been replaced by a polygonal terrace.

The city's fortifications consist of three distinct circles around the city—first, a solid wall of masonry eighteen feet high extending for twenty-two miles around the city.

They sustained the German siege of 1870-71, and the outer forts have since been greatly strengthened. The third line of forts, on the hills of St. Germain, Courmelles and Villiers, are of modern construction, with the latest types of batteries and heavy guns.

The inner wall about Paris surrounds the city, and the most important sections of the city, including the business quarters along the Grand boulevard, the residence sections on the north and west of the city and the Latin quarter and other sections of the city.

ALLIES KEEP GERMANS ON THE RETREAT

French and British Hang on Heels of Invaders

KAISER'S TROOPS FIND IT IMPOSSIBLE TO HALT

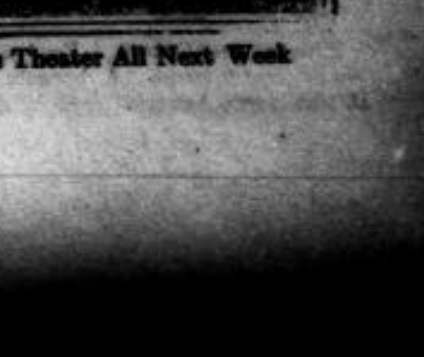
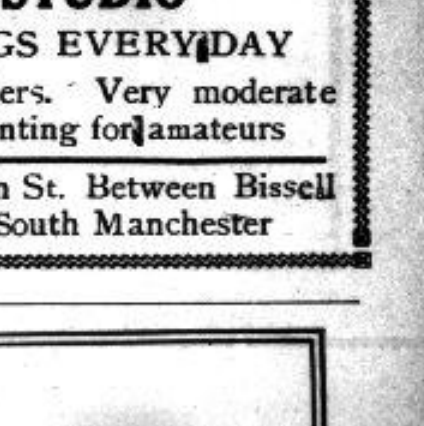
