SPECIAL MEETING

OF NINTH SCHOOL DISTRICT HELD AT HIGH SCHOOL HALL LAST EVENING

Athority Given Borrow Not Exceed One Hundred Thousand Dollars During Year 1914-1915. Two Thousand Dollars Appropriated for Completing Lincoln School

The special meeting of the Ninth School District, held last night to appropriate an additional \$2,000 for the completion of the Lincoln School and to empower the district committee to borrow in the name of the district, on a sum not to exceed \$100,000, did not bring out a large gathering and the whole business was disposed of in less than ten minutes.

The first question brought to the attention of the voters present was the need to empower the committee to borrow the amount claimed for the school, explained that the district had voted to spend for school \$110,000 of this amount \$10,000 was for the addition to the Lincoln School, and \$60,000 for the West Side School.

In explaining the need of \$2,000 additional for the Lincoln School appropriation, Mr. Cheney said that it was found advisable to divide one of the small rooms in the building into three parts, including an administration or office room, a room for the manual department and a room for the library.

There was also an additional expense of \$500 for the sprinkler system. The system on which the appropriation was made provided a wet system in the building and a wet system in the lower. This change in the sprinkler system will cut off approximately one-half of the insurance premiums and is considered a very wise investment.

DIRECT PRIMARY

FOUR HUNDRED EIGHTY ONE BLANK VOTES CAST ON VOTING MACHINES.

Robert J. Smith Makes Whirlwind Entry Into Local Politics And Wins Assessorship Nomination. Two New Men On Board of Selectmen.

The direct primary for the nomination of candidates for town offices, representatives in the legislature and justices of the peace, took place Tuesday and the voting was done upon voting machines, as it was for the first time in this place last year. The Republicans and Democrats were alone in the voting, as the progressives are not to have any contest for town offices, and the prohibitionists and socialists did not poll the necessary ten per cent of the vote to be on the ballot. The general election which would by law permit them to participate in the direct primary.

The assessor was delighted and in every way conducive to getting out a large vote, but the big vote was not forthcoming. There were only 1089 votes cast, 975 of which were upon voting machines, and 25 Democratic. There were 806 republican votes counted at the direct primary last year and 35 Democratic.

There are more than 2900 names on the voting list at present. The Republicans have 1876 registered, the Democrats 300 and the progressives 15. The prohibitionists have 67 voters but they did not register for the primary. Officer William G. Glenney received the highest vote cast at the direct primary, namely 718.

It was found that John D. Cheney received the highest number of votes as a candidate for reelection as selectman, namely 673.

William S. Hyde, candidate for representative, was the next big vote getter, his score standing 673. Howard Robinson Crockett, candidate for the board of selectmen, received the votes of 625 of his fellow republicans as member given 649 as candidate for registrar, and George H. Howe 629 for collector of taxes.

An unusual tribute was paid to the business qualities of Robert J. Smith as nominee for assessor by the fact that he received 543 votes while his two competitors on the republican list received a joint vote of 566. Mr. Smith wanted the office and went out to get it. He did not wait for the office to seek him. He displayed the spirit which characterizes the true First Warder. The motto of the First Warders is "When there is something political to be done go out and do it and do it on your own terms."

It was found that a goodly number of voters cast blank votes on the machines through a misunderstanding of the use thereof. On the republican machines two rows of pointers were in part called into use by the large number of candidates. The first row was entirely filled, showing a list of 30 candidates.

The second row had four names recorded and that left 26 blank spaces. A portion of a row of the pointers on the machines were locked and the remainder on that row left free for use. The machine must lock an entire row or leave the entire string free for operation.

It is supposed that a considerable number of the voters pulled down the pointer beneath the name of some of the men for whom they intended to vote instead of the one which is placed over the name and which must be used in order to make the vote effective. As a result all such votes were not counted, as they were blank.

The instruction sheet, which every voter had ample chance to see, contained the following very simple and clear statement: "Turn down a pointer over the name of each candidate you wish to vote for (in your own party) and leave it there." Had this been done no blank votes would have been registered on the machines.

This erroneous voting did not change the result save in the case of Arthur Cook who was defeated by Arthur E. Bowers as nominee for representative. The machine showed Mr. Bowers received 479 votes and Mr. Cook 476. There were 16 blank votes cast for Mr. Cook, which if properly registered, would have won him the nomination by a margin of seven votes.

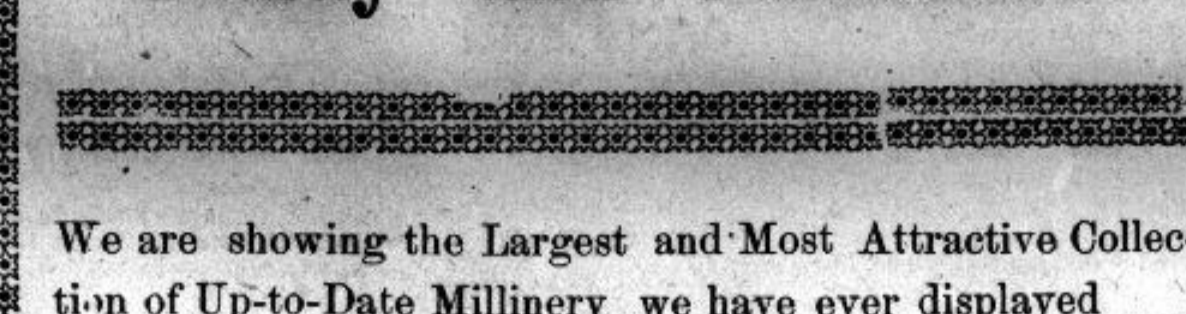

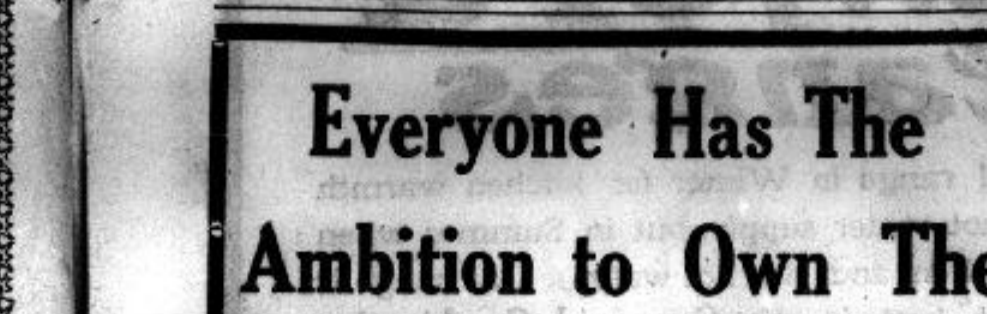

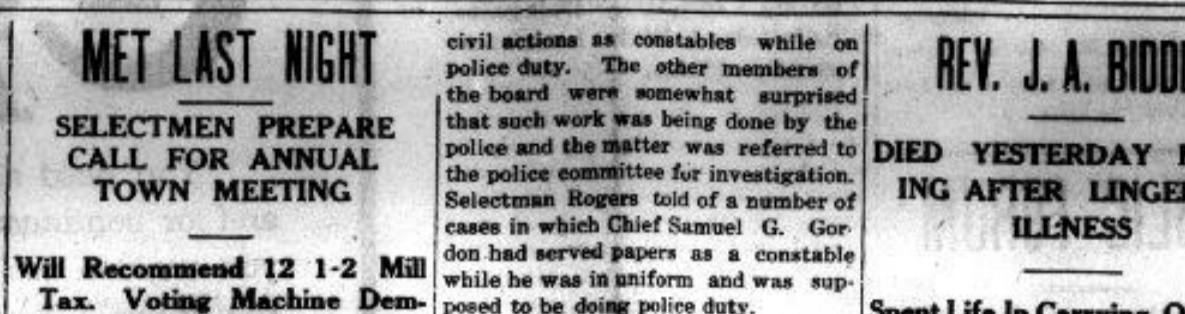
