REV. J. A. BIDDLE DIED YESTERDAY MORNING AFTER LINGERING ILLNESS

Spent Life in Carrying Out Provisions of Golden Rule. Great Friend of Poor and Fallen Humanity. Did Masters Work Cheerfully and Faithfully.

Rev. Jacob Albert Biddle, archdeacon of the Hartford diocese of the Episcopal Church, died at his home on Hamlin street at 3:30 o'clock yesterday morning after an illness which kept him confined to his home for several months and which, it was thought, would cause his death weeks ago.

He kept in touch with the outside world and during his last illness wrote letters of cheer to others. Several months ago he dictated to his wife a message entitled "The Setting Sun" and had it sent to a local newspaper to be published after his death.

His widow he is survived by one brother, George W. Biddle of Fort Scott, Kansas, and by one sister, Mrs. Rachel Crimm, of Toledo, Ohio. Mr. Biddle was born in Rochester, N. Y., in 1845, the son of Rev. Alexander and Madeline Biddle.

He was graduated from Oberlin College in 1870 and the following year in Portland, Oregon, married Miss Anna A. Light of Chicago, who had been a college mate for two years. After a year in Oregon, in missionary work, they returned east and in 1872 he entered Yale University, from which he was graduated in 1875 and entered the Congregational ministry. He served in Milford first and then in Milford to Owasco, N. Y., and again returning to Connecticut became pastor of the Congregational Church in South Norwalk. He remained in the ministry of the Congregational Church for seventeen years and was then ordained to the ministry in the Episcopal Church.

In 1891 he became pastor of St. Mary's Episcopal Church of this place, remaining as rector here for ten years. On his retirement from the charge of St. Mary's Church he served in New Haven, North Brookfield, Mass., and Waterbury, returning to Manchester on his retirement in 1898, desiring to be among his old friends in Manchester.

The funeral will be held Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock at St. Mary's Church. Bishop C. B. Brewster will officiate assisted by Rev. John Lewis of Waterbury, Rev. George Linley of Hartford, Rev. H. B. Bodley of New Britain and Rev. M. Bennett of this place.

The body will lie in state at the church from 1 to 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon.

The burials will be by Rev. E. G. Reynolds of Glastonbury, Rev. Robert Burton of Plainville, Rev. Louis Belden of Unionville, Rev. Frederick Buck of Collinsville, Rev. William H. Robinson of Windsor Locks and Rev. Percy Norwood of Stafford Springs.
