THANKSGIVING DAY NOVEMBER TWENTY-SIX PROCLAMATION BY PRESIDENT WILSON

Year of Special Blessings for United States—Peace With Honor—Country Well Equipped—Can Supply World With Necessities of Life

President Wilson issued his annual Thanksgiving proclamation setting Thursday, November 26 as a day of "Thanksgiving and prayer" and inviting the people to cease their wonted occupations and in their several homes and places of worship to render thanks to Almighty God.

"It has been the honored custom of our people to turn in the fruitful autumn of the year in praise and thanksgiving to Almighty God for his many blessings and mercies to us as a nation. The year that is now drawing to a close since we last observed our day of national thanksgiving has been, while a year of discipline because of the mighty scourge of war and because of the mighty scourge of war and because of the mighty scourge of war, also a year of special blessing for us."

"He has been vouchsafed for us to remain at peace with honor and in our efforts to succor the suffering and supply the needs of those who are in want. We have been privileged by our own peace and self-control to some degree to extend our arms and shape the hopes and purposes of a day of fear and distress. Our people have looked upon their own life as a nation with a deeper comprehension, a deeper realization of their responsibilities as a nation, and a keener sense of the moral and practical significance of what their part among the nations of the world may come to be."

"The fearful effects of foreign war in their own land and commerce have made them feel the more fully and see the more clearly their mutual interdependence. They have seen and have striven to be a helpful co-operation such as they have seldom practiced before. They have been quickened by a great moral stimulation. Their unmistakable ardor for peace, their earnest pity and disinterested sympathy in the suffering, their readiness to help and to think of the needs of others have revealed them to themselves as well as to the world."

"Our crops will feed all who need food, the self-sufficiency of our people amid the most serious anxieties and difficulties and the steadiness and unflinchingness of our business men will serve other nations as well as our own."

"Now, therefore, I, Woodrow Wilson, President of the United States of America, do hereby designate Thursday, the 26th of November next as a day of Thanksgiving and prayer and invite the people throughout the land to cease from their wonted occupations and to spend their day in prayer and thanksgiving to Almighty God."

Postal Savings PEOPLE OF FOREIGN BIRTH GRASPING OPPORTUNITIES PRESENTED European War Prevents Shipping Money Abroad—Cash Kept Here—Public Confidence in Savings System Shows Remarkable Increase in Deposits

The postal savings deposits at the South Manchester post office are still on the jump, according to figures furnished by Postmaster Thomas J. Quah. There have been opened at the local office since the first of October, this year, ten new accounts and more are being opened daily. The total amount of money deposited in the local postal savings bank is now about \$10,000. The maximum balance that can be deposited with the Manchester Trust company is \$10,000. The total number of depositors is 252. Postmaster Quah has recommended that the maximum balance at the Manchester Trust company be increased to \$15,000, and negotiations are now under way between the third assistant postmaster general at Washington and the local bank officials with a view to increasing the maximum balance to that amount. 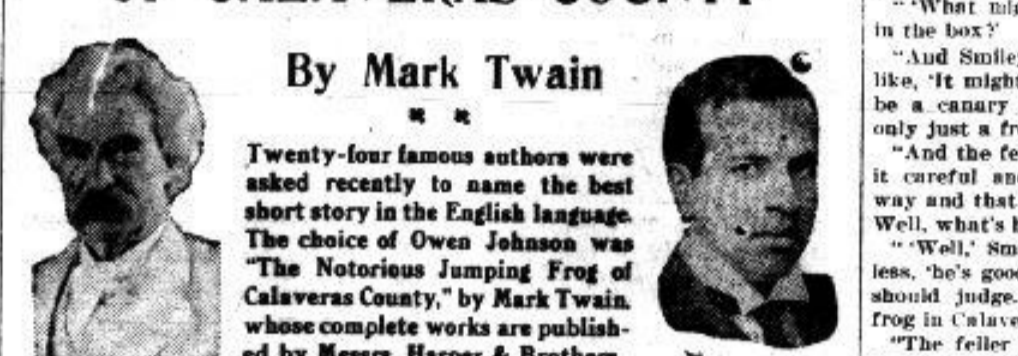

WHAT, WHEN AND HOW TO EAT

Feeding Our Soldier Boys in Mexico.

ONE of the great life insurance companies of New York recently issued a colored sheet to one of its publications, which is sent to all its policy holders, devoted entirely to the question of food. It has gone into a rather scientific discussion as to how its policy holders should eat to live healthily and prolong life. The recognition of the food question by this insurance company is only the first step in a great movement.

The greatest desire of man to live as long as he can, as free from disease as possible. And, inasmuch as man in his final analysis is merely the sum total of what he eats and drinks, it brings the food question to the front and shows obviously that it is the most important thing in the life of every human being. The life insurance company referred to might have gone farther. It might have told its policy holders to eat so as to prevent the causes of such

to 30 degrees below zero, the natives often take as much as sixteen ounces during the day to maintain the requisite body heat. Nature in her wise provision has created the foods in each respective country that will best maintain normal life; therefore in the north, especially in the tropics, matter into all fruits and vegetables are most prolific, especially fruits.

Fruit sugars are of great importance in the diet of the southern people. When we partake of starches they must pass through three different processes of digestion, or three chemical changes, before they can be assimilated into the blood in form of glucose, while fruit sugars pass through but one, and this a very easy one; therefore, the body would require less energy in the digestion of fruit sugars than in a tropical country.

The tropical fruits which are high in protein and carbohydrates are foods suitable for one residing in a cold country. Milk, eggs, meats, and fish are also good, but these are not so plentiful in the tropics. As the temperature becomes warmer the best producing elements, such as fats, starches and sugars, should be gradually reduced.

BREAKFAST:

Any one of two fresh vegetables such as peas, cauliflower, tomatoes, sprouts, asparagus, green beans, or spinach, with a small service of milk.

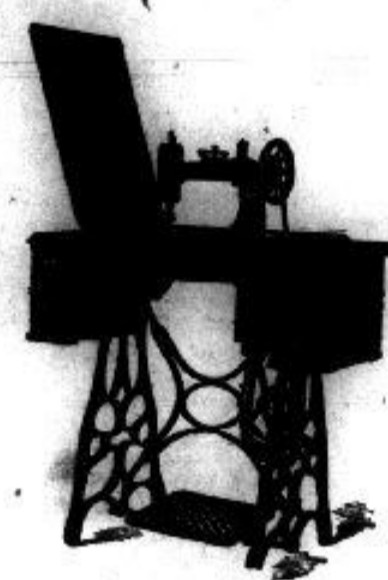
