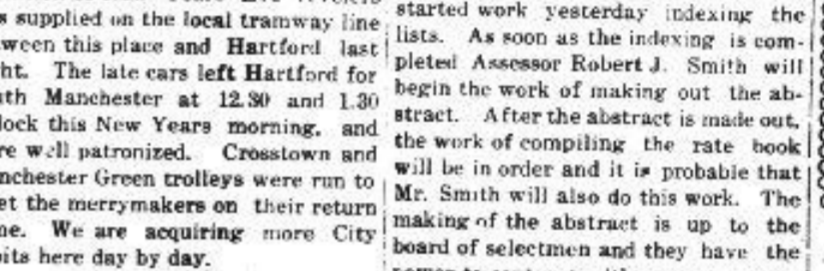

CITIES LAID OUT BY EXPERTS

As an organized act, city planning is a new thing. It had its birth in the last generation, when mills, factories, and workshops threatened with extinction the life, health, and beauty of the towns.

These cities were the individual creations of ambitious rulers, eager to show their power and to glorify their names.

RURAL SECTIONS LAG BEHIND. Thirty years ago the American city was regarded as hopeless.
