SUMMER SCHEDULE Velvet Mills Open Until Seven P. M. The velvet mills will close at noon Saturdays beginning this week and continuing during the summer and perhaps later, depending somewhat upon orders and also upon the vagaries of our weather, but certainly variable New England weather. It is intended however to maintain a 60-hour schedule and to that end it is necessary to operate the velvet mills an extra hour each of the first five days of the week in order to meet the requirements of the Saturday half-holiday. Operations are started in the silk mills daily at seven o'clock in the morning and the velvet mills will be operated until seven o'clock in the evening, as noted above. There is an abundance of velvet orders and the mills must keep up with the work as well as possible, even though the Saturday half holiday be given. The velvet department has been operating 60 hours each week all through the winter and spring, and present indications are that this situation will continue. In any case for the present it is a continuation of the 60-hour schedule only the hours of labor are changed in order to permit of our observing half-holiday. Most of the other departments of the silk mills have been and now are operating a 55-hour schedule.

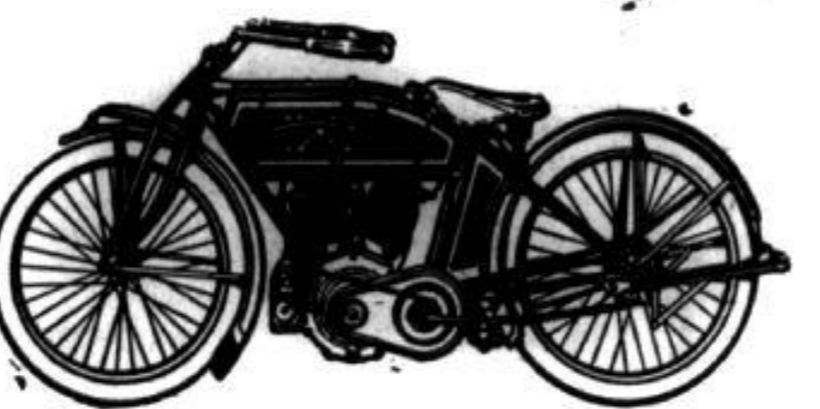
