Appeal To Reason. (Continued)
It is worthy of note that the railway management of Prussia forbids the use of beer while on duty, to switchman, engine drivers and dispatchers. While according to Dr. Henke of Heidelberg, 50 per cent. of all railway accidents are due to alcoholic stimulants. As to Germany being the greatest beer drinkers, however much Mr. Spence may think that a credible fact, he cannot claim that Germany has more beer than many nations than any other nation, and despite this claims of the brewer that the use of beer decreases the consumption of distilled liquors, Belgium ranks second in the per capita consumption of distilled liquors as well. "Although the wages in the liquor industry are among the best, yet the degree of exploitation is greater than in any other phase of the capitalist system. The exploitation in all the industries of the United States averages 48.8 per cent; in the liquor business it goes up to 78 per cent."
"In addition to the exploitation of labor in the production of alcoholic liquors, which is the highest in any of the industries, the liquor traffic still further exploits labor in excessive charges (compared to the cost of production) which the liquor retailer adds to the consumer, and what is worst of all, exploits the working class through the evil effects resulting from the use and abuse of alcoholic drinks."
"The socialist party cannot remain indifferent to the suffering and wretchedness of the millions who are ruined by the liquor traffic."
"We demand the restriction of the sale of alcoholic beverages."

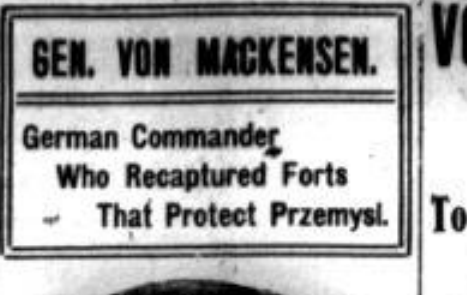

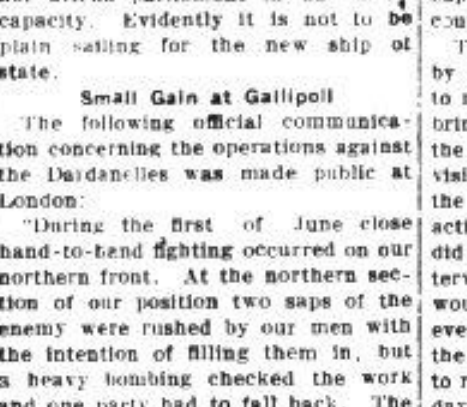
