American Note

Considered as Being Very Close to an Ultimatum

WORDS "UNFRIENDLY ACT"

Mean Breaking Off of Friendly Relations With German Government Should Rights of Neutrals Be Abandoned in Future—Discussion of Principles Involved Concluded. Washington, July 23.—The last German note of President Wilson was made public in the United States Saturday. 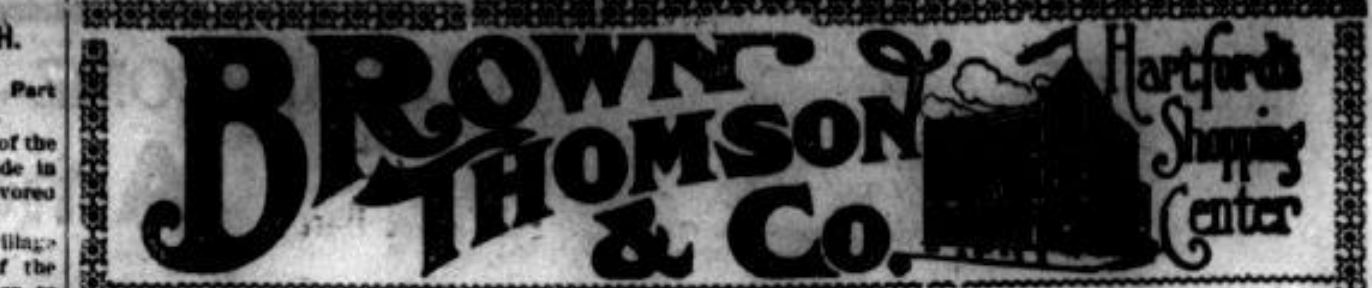
