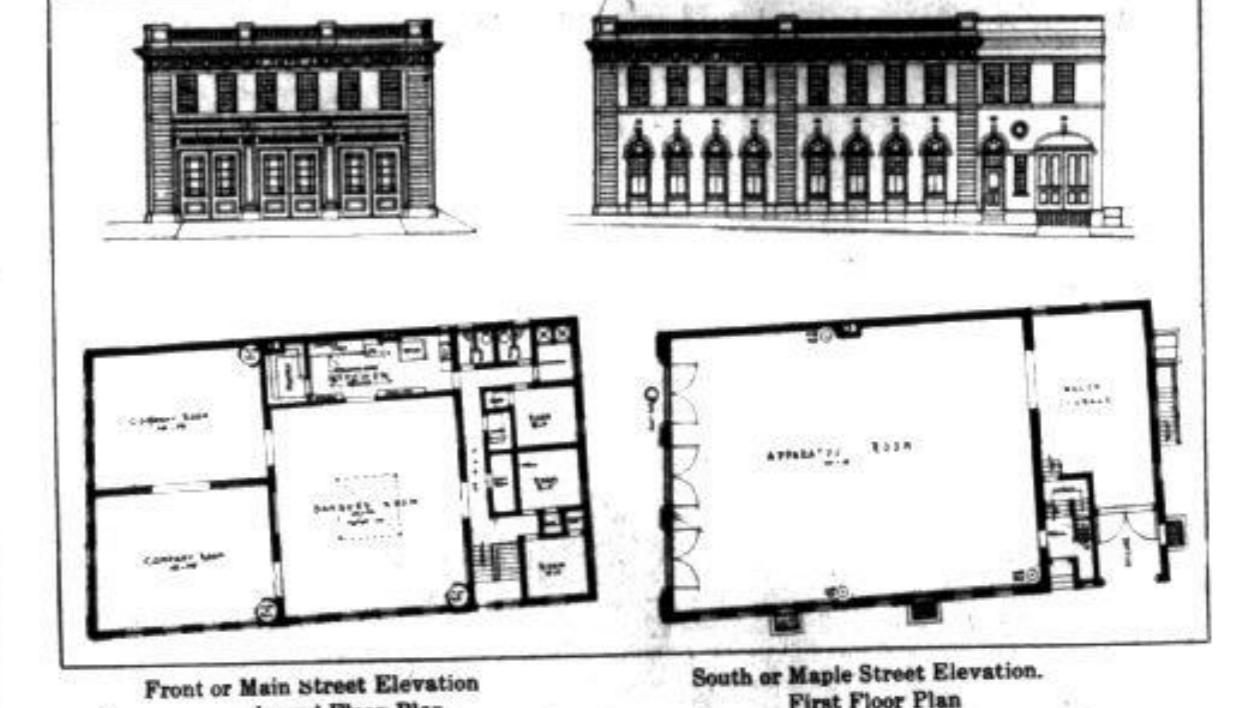

The referendum vote on the proposed amendments to the town charter was held yesterday. The voting was done on three machines and one machine was used for demonstration.

Section 1. Section fifteen of an act concerning the nomination of candidates for public office and the number, powers, and duties of town officers in the town of Manchester, approved June 28, 1907, as amended by act approved April 9, 1913, is hereby amended to read as follows: There shall be elected annually in the town of Manchester, on the first Monday of October, a board of selectmen consisting of seven members.

Section 2. Each member of said committee shall hold office for the term of one year and until his successor is appointed and qualified.
