**ELDRIDGE SITE BEST**  
FIRE COMMISSIONERS GET REDUCTION OF \$1,000 ON PROPERTY  
Main and Maple Street Proposition Best Place for Department Headquarters Sav Commissioners—Other Sites Have High Valuation  
The fire commissioners of the South Manchester fire district gave notice in the advertising columns of the News today that there will be a special meeting of the voters of the district at the town hall, next Thursday evening, November 18, at 8 o'clock, to further consider the proposition of the committee, headed by the department headquarters for How Company No. 2 and How & Ladd Company No. 4. This question was up for action at the annual meeting of the district in August, but the voters at that time did not accept the recommendations of the fire commissioners to purchase the lot with building located thereon at the junction of Main and Maple streets, which is owned by the Eldridge estate. The voters of the district at that time thought the price of the site was too high and felt that it was not to the advantage of the district in placing department headquarters further north. Following the discussion at the annual meeting the fire commissioners were instructed to continue their search for a suitable location and report at another meeting.

August a majority of the voters present voted to reject the recommendations of the district officials for a department headquarters of Companies No. 2 and No. 4 at the corner of Main and Maple streets. On a ballot vote 50 were opposed to the proposition while 51 favored the idea. The leaders of the opposition to the plan carried their point on a plea that the cost of the site was excessive. At that time the commissioners had an option on the site which is 47,100 feet and which included the building on the site. It is understood that at next Thursday's meeting the commissioners will recommend that the site be bought at a cost of \$10,000, \$1,000 less than was asked for the same in August. The commissioners have been over the situation very carefully and have secured prices on several pieces of property that might be used for a department headquarters and will make a complete report at the meeting, but they still feel that the location at the junction of Main and Maple streets is the best that they can offer the voters of the district at this time. Not only is the proposed location brought into consideration in the matter, but the price quoted is looked upon as very favorable. The commissioners have an offer from the owners of the Keating property at the junction of Forest and Main streets, but will not recommend its purchase at the price quoted. The Manning lot at Oak and Cottage streets has been looked at and a price placed on same. The property of the Orford Realty company at the junction of Main and Bissell streets has been considered and a price placed on same. (Continued on Page 7.)

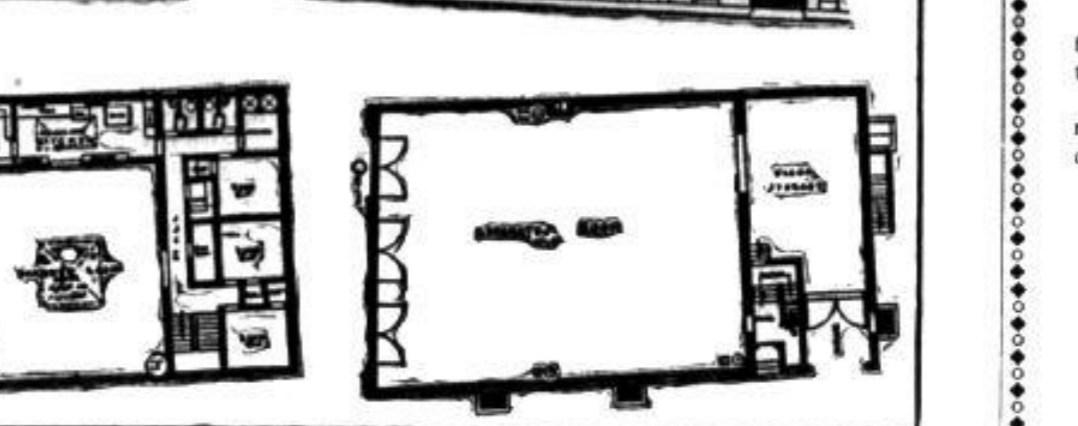
