DISTRICT MEETING VOTED AGAINST RECOMMENDATION OF COMMISSIONERS

Proposition Lost by Only Eighteen Votes - Sentiment in District Fairly Well Divided on Question - Matter Held Up Second Time

Following the introduction of this motion, which moved the killing of the Main street proposition and the maintaining of separate buildings for Companies 3 and 4, there ensued a talkfest that lasted an hour and one-half. It was apparent that a majority of those present were in favor of keeping the expenses of the district at a low figure and any remarks for a change were applauded.

Chairman Cheney made the report of the district committee. A proposed site for a fire department building.
