Center Church

Had Prosperous Year—Much Activity in All Departments The annual meeting of the Ecumenical church of the Center Congregational church took place Monday evening. The financial committee was re-elected and composed the following persons: F. A. Verplank, chairman; Samuel Stevenson, C. W. Holmes, Frank Cheney, Jr., and J. A. Hood. The society's committee is as follows: G. H. Miller, chairman; T. H. Bidwell and R. LaMotte Russell, the latter taking the place of H. B. House whose term of three years expired. The choir members comprise: E. S. Elna, chairman; Mrs. J. A. Alford and C. W. Holmes.

The board of assessors finished their revaluation of all the taxable property in town last Wednesday afternoon and a complete list of property owners paying on \$2,000,000 over will be found below. The report of assessors, S. Emil Johnson, Robert J. Smith and Joseph Altonso have been applying themselves diligently for six years and the assessment ever since last October and while their effort is not as yet complete they have their revaluation figures fixed. That the public might learn what the assessors are on those paying taxes on \$2,000 or over the reporters were right on their jobs last Wednesday afternoon and within a few minutes after all the figures were placed on the assessment reports last finished a list of the biggest taxpayers, as appears further on in this article.

The work of revaluation is done each five years and is authorized by a town law. That the taxable property in Manchester was assessed at nearly its real value has been apparent for some years past, according to the report of the state tax commissioner. The increase in the lists this year comes chiefly through the increase in value of real property. Along the business section and in the fast growing portions of the town increases as high as twenty per cent. have been made, while in other sections the increase has been moderate, but these are few and far between. Land values as a rule are not on the decline in this town, but on the contrary are on the upward turn.

Many of the taxpayers neglected to file their lists this year and as a result the assessors had to make up the lists of the delinquents. One of our local manufacturers neglected to attend to the task of making out his list and for his neglect he was assessed some \$2,000. Cheney Brothers, as is their custom, pay taxes on. His largest amount on assessed last year was \$1,200 on \$10,225,222, while last year he was assessed on \$8,122,228. E. J. Holl was assessed on \$80,000 last year and this year on \$91,000. The Bon Air estate paid on \$75,000 in 1915, \$80,000. The South Manchester Light, Power & Traction Company from \$100,000 to \$120,000.

Robert J. Smith, clerk of the board of assessors, is busy marking out the abstract of the grand list and until this work can be finished it will not be known just what the revaluation work of the assessors will amount to. The assessors feel that it will be around \$2,000,000. With this bit of information tax payors can begin to ponder on what the tax-rate will be for the year, a question that will be settled at an adjourned annual town meeting to be held next month.
