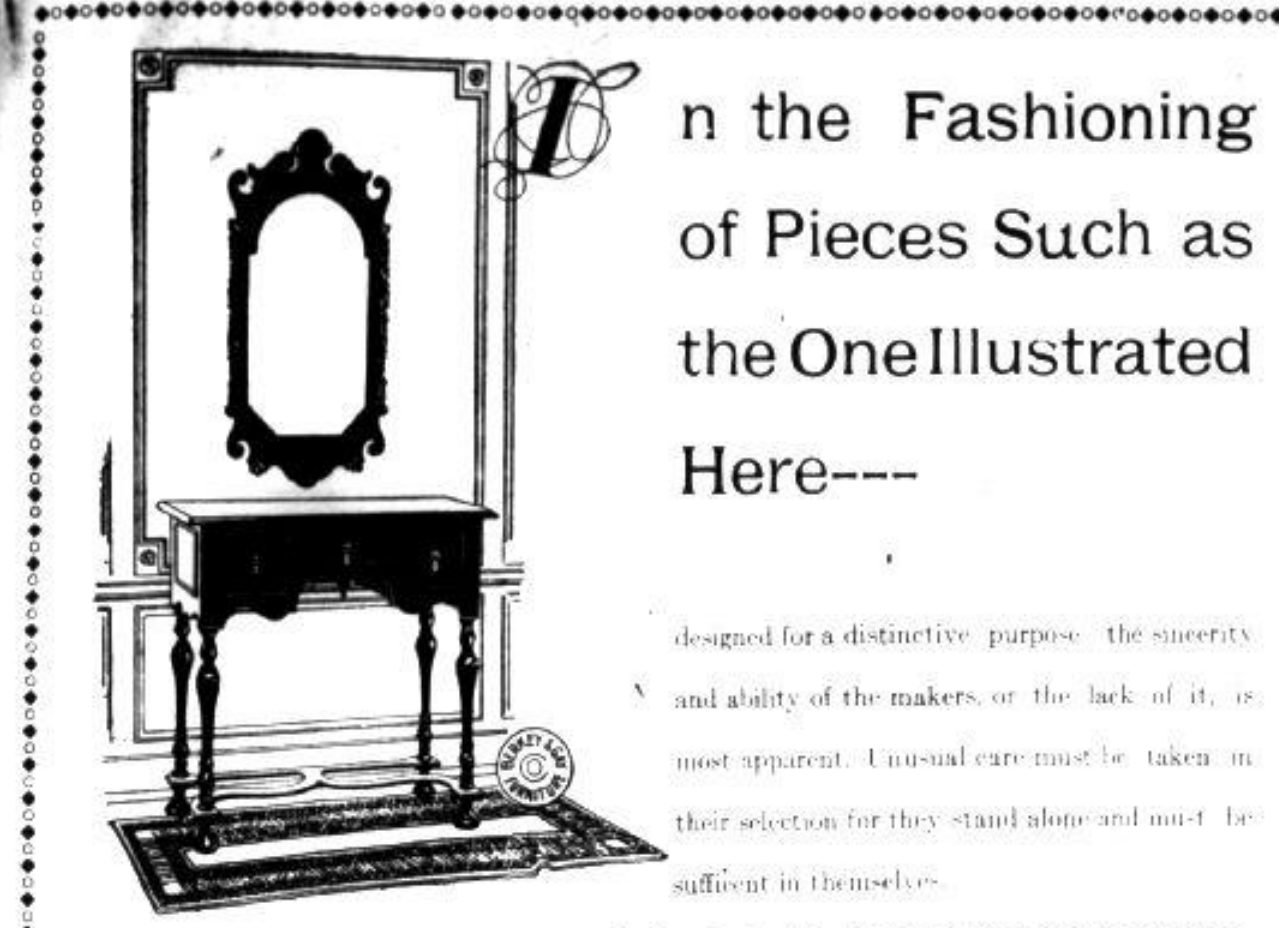

INCREASE OF \$2,253,876 OBJECT TO ASSESSMENT

Manchesters grand list totals \$11,423,976 according to the abstract of the grand list which was completed and signed this morning by the members of the board of assessors.

The figures as compiled from the books of the assessors, this morning indicate an increase of \$2,253,876 over the grand list of last year.
