WILL MEET TONIGHT

TO CONSIDER PLANS FOR PROPOSED NEW BUILDING FOR CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

At the regular monthly meeting of the Manchester Chamber of Commerce held last week John Cairns made a plea for the ownership of a home for the Chamber of Commerce and explained the reasons for the fact that it was in him as well in the columns of The News last week.

Mr. Cairns presented the proposition in such a favorable light that it won the approval of those present, and on motion Chairman Frank H. Anderson was authorized to appoint a committee to make necessary investigations, ascertain the cost of a site and building and bring in suggestions for putting the proposed plan into successful operation.

Mr. Cairns had hoped and expected that the vacant lot at the junction of Main and Biwell streets might be secured for this purpose at reasonable cost. This opportunity however has passed as the site in question was purchased by Frank Donohue of Biwell street last week.

It is understood that the entire cost of the land and the building need not be paid at once. The men back of the project can readily get all the money they require on notes.

SHOWN IN GRAND LIST OF MANCHESTER IN 1915

Total Valuation of Taxable Property as Determined by Board of Assessors \$21,482,979

Manchester's grand list totals \$21,482,979 according to the abstract of the grand list which was completed and signed this morning by the members of the board of assessors.

The grand list of last year of \$19,229,103 there will be some retrogression made from this total by the board of assessors.

The figures compiled from the books of the assessors this morning indicate an increase of \$2,253,876 in the grand list of 1915.

It is interesting to note that the increase in the grand list is due to an increase in the value of the property assessed.

The board of assessors will meet this evening to consider the grand list and to make such changes as may be necessary.
