VOTERS DECIDE ON TEN MILL TAX RATE

TAXPAYERS HAD MINDS FIXED BEFORE MEETING

The annual town meeting and a special town meeting attracted a body of voters to the town hall last Monday evening that taxed the old hall to its capacity.

The voters were present to hear arguments on the tax question. A considerable number stayed for the special meeting which followed the adjourned session.

Chairman Taylor said the board of selectmen had estimated the total cost of running the town during the year at \$238,712.90.

Some figures were compiled before the annual town meeting. At the annual town meeting the voters had increased the appropriation by \$20,000 over the estimate.

Charles Cheney remarks. Charles Cheney said he had been coming to the town meetings for service for many years and had wanted to hear Mr. Rogers make a good speech and he had just made it.

Rogers asks for ten mills. Following the presentation of the resolution of Chairman Taylor and the explanation as to the necessity of a three-mill rate selectmen Rogers made an amendment that the rate be ten mills instead of thirteen.
